Neighbors, the board of directors of fifteen associations joined with Farmington Hills September 23rd in petitioning the Township Board to reject any replatting of a subdivision which involves reduction of lot sizes. The petitioners were Farmington Hills Improvement Ass'n, Franklin Forest & Fairway Ass'n, Glen Oaks Council, Glenwood Ass'n, Greenacres Civic & Improvement Ass'n, Indiantown Ass'n, Kendallwood Ass'n, Old Farm Colony Ass'n, Schroeder Farms Ass'n, Settlers Ass'n, Spring Valley (Rougemont) Civic Ass'n, West Farm Estates Property Owners Ass'n, Westgate Civic Ass'n and Woodbine Improvement Ass'n.

AT A MEETING held September 25th, a progress report on the Kendallwood Swimming Club was given to member applicants. New State Law to Control Shoplifting Now in Effect

Under the provisions of a new statute, enacted by the 1958 session of the Legislature, shoplifting active in our retail stores will no longer be able to take advantage of "legal loopholes."

The new law provides the merchant in Michigan with the proper legal backing necessary to the correction of the situation. Under the provisions of the new law, a merchant will have the right to protect his merchandise and cut shoplifting losses by apprehending known shoplifters without fear of unfair reprisals in the form of exorbitant actions for false arrest and defamation of character.
