

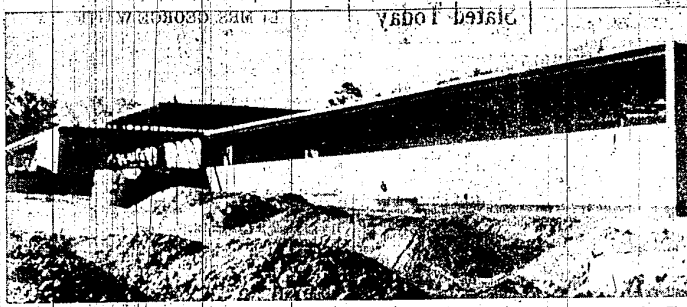
Bond PTA to Hear Noted Speaker
