Difficulties Many in Filming of "Martin Luther," Says Producer

Luther Wolf, producer for Louis de Rochemont Associates, gave the following sidelight report on the filming of the "Martin Luther" film being shown here of charge this Sunday at 6:30 p.m. in the Farmington Junior High School. It is being sponsored by Antioch Evangelical Lutheran Church, the United Lutheran congregation in the Farmington area.

"Four hundred and thirty-five years after he nailed the thesis to the church door in Wittenberg, Martin Luther is still a controversial figure. In Germany, where we produced the film, the reformer's life, the natives were as skeptical about foreigners as Americans would be. If Europeans came to the United States to film the life of George Washington, even the pontiff, a group of Luther's countrymen, the producers, didn't believe the film could be made acceptable to Luther's countrymen. To everyone's surprise, they liked the finished film and a German language version has also been made," Wolf said.

"When I was assigned as producer, writer Alan Sloan had already examined hundreds of wood cuts and sketches of the 16th century, plugging through the old records about Luther, read most of his writings, and consulted many theologians and historians. It took months more to condense and organize the enormous volume of factual material into a screenplay. Even after shooting began, producers and Lutheran advisors including the General Synod of the United Lutheran Church, were busy polishing and strengthening the script.

"Casting for the main roles was done in London, while scouts in Germany found some English-speaking German actors who had never before worked in films.

"Nevertheless, it was much easier to find the right type extras in Germany than it would have been in the U.S. In the small village of Wartburg, where Luther lived, the village and Hesse look more like 16th century costumes than in modern dress; the village manager never had any difficulty finding good extras with strong, interesting, authentic faces.

"The pride of authenticity was high. Shooting sound was done on the very bank of the busy Rhine; presented a real production problem. One motor-produced barge chugged past. As we looked on helplessly, an excursion boat, its wheels churning and splashing merrily, crept down the river. The greatest blow of all came when we saw John Rudolph, one of the actors on our deck, waving gallily to us from the barge. He was completely lost by our accusing expressions.

"Weather was another story. People in the state of Hesse take pride in their bright autumn. When I arrived in Wittenberg in June to schedule the production, the studio man

Helping Form St. Mary Hosp. Women's Guild

The St. Mary Hospital Guild held its first board of directors meeting on October 9th at Ladywood Church, where the Guild members met to discuss constitution, by-laws and to elect officers. The Guild is organizing this new women's guild.

The purpose of the guild will be to promote the interests of the St. Mary Hospital which is being constructed at Levan and Five Mile Roads, completion of which is expected in November, 1959.

The board of directors have set as their goal 200 members. "There is no reason why we can't reach that goal," Mrs. J. E. Smith, president of the Guild, stated. "We have an excellent and enthusiastic Board. If hard work will do the job, we will do it."

The Guild membership will encompass Livonia, Northville, Farmington, Plymouth and Redford.

Although a date has not been set as yet for the first meeting of the Guild, it is expected that the Guild will hold its first meeting before the end of the year.

Active membership dues will be \$2 per year, sustaining membership, \$5. Patrons are listed at \$25 and up, the list of whom will be placed in the cornerstone of the building.

Upon its completion, the hospital will be one of the most modern and best equipped in the country. It will be operated by the Catholic Sisters and will be non-sectarian in its board of directors, staff, patients and guild members.

Participation by the entire congregation will again be the theme of the cornerstone laying for the new Lutheran Church of the Shepherd King, at the corner of West Maple Road and Middlebelt.

All worshippers will assist symbolically in the erection of the church wall at the special ceremony to be held Sunday, after noon, October 26, 1958, at 3:30 p.m.

Rev. A. Karl Boehmke, pastor of the mission congregation will conduct the service. Rev. Richard Stuckmeyer, pastor of Grace Lutheran Church, Pontiac, will preach the sermon.

The Choir of Grace Lutheran Church, Redford, under the direction of Mrs. V. Halbo, will sing a musical version of the 121st Psalm, composed for the occasion.

The rite of the cornerstone laying will be performed by David T. Schwick, president of the congregation, and Walter O. Gaertner, director of the Mission Board of the English District, Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, sponsoring church body for the new congregation. Papers of historical value to the congregation will be placed in a copper box imbedded in the corner stone.

Following this ceremony, each member of the congregation will place a brick into the wall of the building, symbolizing the part of each in the building of the church, and giving expression to the biblical teaching: "You are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief Corner Stone; in whom all the building is fitted together, and groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord."

Ground was broken for the building, September 7, in a similar service in which all worshippers participated.

The church building, planned by Charles Stadel and Associates of Park Ridge, Illinois, will be of contemporary design. It will be the first of three units planned for the seven-acre site. The nave, or worship area, will seat 170 worshippers, with space for another 120 in the adjoining social hall. Meeting rooms, pastor's study and kitchen will complete the plan.

The public is invited to the cornerstone laying service. Regular Sunday services are conducted at the Eagle School, Middlebelt, and West 14 Mile Road, while work progresses on the new structure.
