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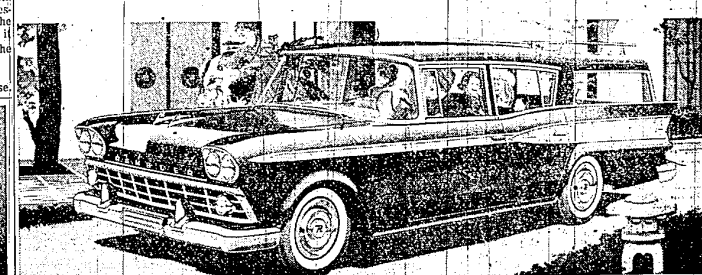

CITY INCORPORATION PROPOSAL:

"Shall the following described territory in Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, be incorporated as a City under the provisions of Act 279 of the Public Acts of 1909; as amended:

WHEREAS, heretofore on May 19, 1958, pursuant to Act 279 of the Public Acts of 1909, as amended, a petition was filed by certain resident electors and freeholders of the area, praying for the incorporation of the territory described as:

"Territory located within the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, more particularly described as:

Section 23 excluding that part now proposed to be incorporated as part of the City of Farmington Woods, Sections 26, 34 and 35 excluding that part of Sections 26, 34 and 35 which is a part of the City of Farmington, and all of Section 36."

That the form and sufficiency of the petition heretofore filed on May 19, 1958, praying for the submission of the question of incorporation of the City to be known as "Clarenceville" to consist of the territory described in said petition, complies with the provisions of the Act being Act 279 of the Public Acts of 1909, as amended, and are in all respects regular:

That November 4, 1958, be set as the date for a Special Election on the question of incorporating the City of Clarenceville.

Notice Relative to Opening and Closing of the Polls

ELECTION LAW, ACT 116, P. A. 1954

SECTION 720. On the day of any election the polls shall be opened at 7 o'clock in the forenoon, and shall be continuously open until 8 o'clock in the afternoon and no longer. Every qualified elector present and in line at the polls at the hour prescribed for the closing thereof shall be allowed to vote.
