Here's What Happens After Area Votes to Become City

Certain well defined steps follow approval by the voters in any area of a proposal to incorporate as a city.

This information was furnished by Judge Allen C. Ingle as it would apply to the proposed City of Clarencville. It should apply also to the Farmington Woods incorporation.

VOTERS ALSO ballot Nov. 4 in charter commission members, and the nine receiving the most votes make-up this commission.

If the incorporation proposal carries, the charter commission must convene within ten days. The commission will do the following:

- (a) Frame a charter within 90 days.
(b) Provide the manner of naming the candidates for the first elective offices in the proposed charter.
(c) Fix the date for the charter election which may be a special election or at the same time as a general election.

presently levied on a Township basis. To illustrate how easily this might occur, the amount levied on the property tax in the proposed Farmington Woods area were to rise from \$12,986 to \$25,962.

But suppose that incorporation levies are desired and obtained additional services. Since the service levels might vary the costs, a reasonable level of services to be provided would be at the average service level for other units of similar population size.

A CHARTER can be voted up on only three times. If rejected three times or if no charter is adopted within ten years, all proceedings are voided.

If a charter is accepted by the people, the city does not become incorporated until the charter has been filed with the County Clerk in duplicate. One copy is forwarded to the Secretary of State and the date this copy is received by the Secretary of State is the date the city comes into existence.

and/or hamper the operation of the unit of government as a whole. For if, to some, an incorporation suggests a way of maintaining the status quo, it also indicates potential difficulties.

Farmington Woods - Providing police and fire protection to Farmington Woods might present problems primarily because of its size and its irregular boundaries (P. 12).

In addition, the irregularity of the proposed city's boundaries would limit any economies that might otherwise be achieved in the performance of public works functions - roads, rubbish collection, etc.

Present sanitary sewage disposal is handled by individual septic tanks throughout the township, with some exceptions. The present method of sewage disposal, irrespective of incorporations, is intertwined with the Farmington Interceptor to be constructed by the Oakland County Department of Public Works.

Planning - The township has detailed plans for future services on a township basis. Should the areas incorporate, the plans no longer would be useful (P. 23).

DATA from a sample of eighty-six Michigan cities in the 2,500-10,000 population class - cities within the approximate population range of the Michigan, Farmington and Farmington Woods areas - reveal that these cities in 1956 received \$6.9 (P. 23) per capita of their general revenues from the property tax and that property tax collections were \$31.68 per capita.

UF Drive Still Short of Goal

United Foundation Torch Drive collections in the Farmington area, for the year ended \$12,937.17, an official report revealed.

THIS is slightly under \$3,000 below the goal set for Farmington this year.

OF this total, \$10,582.57 was collected from local residents, business places and government employes, with the remaining \$1,855.20 coming from donations made by employees in the Farmington school system, the report revealed.

ALTHOUGH Farmington has still not reached its quota it is well ahead of several other communities. Only \$8,636.87 had been collected in the Wayne, Oakland and Macomb area as of this date or 55 percent of the goal, it was revealed.
