Local Family Adopts Two Korean Children

Two Korean children arrived in Farmington this month to make their permanent home as adopted children of Mr. and Mrs. Philip Gruner of 2509 Orchard Lake Road.

They are Jay, Yung Lee, 9, and Little Ben, 6. (Given the American name of Benjamin Lee Gruner, ways, she added.

Having a real love and keen interest in the welfare of children, the Gruners have been getting along and care to needy children since 1950. Over the years, they have adopted 15 children in some way since this time.

The Gruners now have four children. Two other American-born youngsters who they adopted earlier and are raising are Roy, 13, and Richard, 12. Roy is a student at Dunckel Junior High and Richard the Cloverdale elementary school.

Although Corinne and Ben have been here only a short time, they are becoming acclimated to the ways of Americans and real rapidly. Mrs. Gruner indicated, "Neither speak English well enough to put sentences together but both are learning. It was approximately two years ago that the Gruners began their efforts to obtain two Korean children for adoption. Through their wants and needs of the children, through the help of the World Vision Child Placement Service they became sponsors of two orphan children in Seoul, Korea, and indicated at that time that they would like to bring two to America for a English speaking people in their adoption.

The two Lee children, who it was felt would best fit in with the Gruner family, were finally released to them. They are not the same children who they had been sponsoring.

"Even though we have Corinne and Ben, we still continue to sponsor the two other children in Seoul," Mrs. Gruner said.

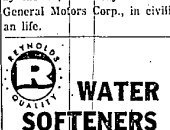
