Why Students Pick Teaching

Chance to work with young people is the reason most often given by students entering the teaching profession, says Professor Robert Dixon, professor of education at The University of Michigan. Professor Dixon, who is co-ordinator of U-M student teaching in secondary education, emphasizes that this is particularly true at the elementary level. "At the secondary level many student teachers are led by interest and feel that teaching is one way they can pursue their interest. But here, too, they are led by interest in the contribution they can make to the personal development of the young people they teach," he says. Professor Dixon also notes that individuals who elect teaching as a career feel that they can be more independent than they could be in clerical or secretarial jobs. "They like having responsibility for a group of youngsters. They also like the amount of freedom in planning their work. Then, of course, many look forward to longer vacations, and opportunities for travel."

How do they feel about salary? Says Professor Dixon, "In general, they feel that salary compensation is quite adequate, particularly beginning salaries. Our average salary this year was around \$4,100."
