Failure Can

Stimulate, Says

U. M. Professor

"Failure to one child is a
traumatic, but to another it may
be a necessary challenge," says
Stanley E. Diamond, professor of
education at The University of
Michigan.

It is a part of the guidance func-
tion and part of the child's ex-
perience. It should be individual-
ized to a specific child, he
states.

"A rigid policy of 100 percent
promotion should be avoided, as
much as an automatic failure of
10 percent. Promotion should be
flexible and based on a mul-
titude of factors. All available
individual factors should be
considered, including the wishes
of the pupil and the parents.

"Students have shown repeatedly
that pupils who move along with
their age groups learn as
much as pupils who are kept
back a grade. Apparently, the
child will learn as much as he
remains with his group as if he
is not promoted.

"There are, however, two cau-
tions to be observed: 1) as the
slow learner advances through
the grades, his progress may not
be as rapid as that of the pupils
in the regular group. 2) the in-
creased range of individual
differences; 2) the normal pup-
ils may not be challenged by
the work of the slow learner.

"Speaking of the effects of failure,
Professor Diamond said at times
they are lost at games; they do
not do arithmetic problems cor-
rectly; another child reads be-
hind; a pupil has worn out his
clothes. It is probably impossi-
ble to mature in our society
without experiencing failure.

Phasant Hunting

Knowing hunters have a new
weapon and are using chicks
to help put phasants in the
game bag. This is the story
from the Midwest, as reported
to the National Wildlife Federa-
tion by a Michigan hunter.

By use of lightly driven stakes at
