To Lay St. Mary Hospital Cornerstone in December

A step of achievement will be recognized by St. Mary Hospital, Livonia, with the laying of the cornerstone which is to take place in December.

Construction on the hospital has reached 26 percent of its entirety to date, officials said. Presently the St. Mary Hospital administration staff is gathering and checking material which will be used to compile the St. Mary Hospital "Book of Appreciation." The book will be a permanent memorial etched in hand-tooled leather and will enclose names of donors a number of contributors, thus memorializing their contributions to the hospital.

For donors who have thought of a memorial, a suitable bronze plaque bearing the name of the donor or a name of any individual - living or dead - designated by the donor, will mark each room and all equipment valued at \$1000 or more. All pledges who have not completed their obligations are asked to do so as soon as possible so that their name may appear in the "Book of Appreciation."

"The increasing population of the communities to be served by the hospital; extensive use of health insurance plans; heightened confidence in the hospital as a place in which to get well - all make the progress of St. Mary Hospital an answer to a desperate situation," a spokesman for the hospital board said.

The administration staff of the hospital makes an appeal to this time to all new residents of Farmington to share in the memorial opportunities in St. Mary Hospital, any of which will be of lasting satisfaction to the donor and of vital service to suffering humanity.

The Catholic Felician Sisters have begun this major project on a Federal grant, and on contributed and borrowed money, because they felt that the health problems of the communities demanded a solution. They ask you to share their burden. Any gift - large or small - will be gratefully accepted.

"No gift is ever too small. A little from many makes a lot for all," the spokesman concluded.

C'ville Methodist Plans Special Service at New Church Site

This Sunday afternoon, Nov. 23, at 3 p.m., a very memorable service for the Clarenceville Methodist Church will be held.

The congregation and officials of the church will meet at the site of the new church at Lorion and Middlebelt Road in Livonia for a special signing ceremony.

The choir will sing and organist, Mrs. Paul Arensman, will play the portable organ. Minister, Rev. Elsie A. Johns, will then speak briefly followed by the erection of the sign "Future Site of the Clarenceville Methodist Church by the board of trustees."

The Clarenceville Methodist Church has experienced a tremendous growth in the last 17 years, an official spokesman stated. In 1941 it was a closed church without membership funds.

The church now has 752 members and a splendid plant, and parsonage all paid for. The Sunday School now has an average attendance of 500. Rev. Johns has led the congregation since 1941.

The present plant has thus been outgrown. This is why plans are now underway for a beautiful church and educational unit to be built within the next five years.

Methodist Men Club Chartered

Robert G. Mayfield, executive secretary of the board, states that, "We seek to mobilize through Methodist Men the tremendous power and enthusiasm of the men of the church. Our purpose is to give strength to the program of Christ and His Church through consecrated service of men in every local church of Methodism."

St. John's One Year Old Nov. 17; To Dedicate Church Sunday

Exactly one year on November 17 the first families of the congregation met in the Farmington Junior High to hear Rev. E. H. Schalkhauser preach the first sermon ever delivered for what is now St. John's American Lutheran Church.

The new church will be dedicated this Sunday, November 23. The dedication of members will be at 10:30 a.m. and Rev. E. H. Schalkhauser, president of the Michigan District, will be the speaker. The formal church dedication will be at 7:30 p.m. when Rev. E. H. Schalkhauser, assistant to the president in charge of Missions, Michigan District, will be the speaker. Dedication service of Holy Communion will be held the following Sunday, November 30, at 10:30 a.m. with Pastor Donald Good as speaker.

On December 7 at 10:30 a.m. there will be a Dedication of Altar and Chancel Appointments. Speaker will be Rev. G. A. Sahellhauser, pastor of the Truth Lutheran Church of Detroit.

Ground work for the new mission (No. 102) was laid by Miss Jean Minneman, former district parish worker now serving in a parsonage who canvassed the Farmington area in 1955. After several requests by residents of the area, the Board of American Missions of the American Lutheran Church paved the way for the start of the mission.

Work was soon underway to purchase property on which a parsonage and church could be built. The property on Gill Rd. was considered ideal and its purchase was soon finalized by the Mission Board of the Michigan District.

On January 1, 1958, Rev. Donald Good was called to serve St. John's. After graduating from Capital University in 1950 and from the Seminary there in June of 1954, he served as assistant pastor at Grace Lutheran Church in Washington, D.C. After his pastorate there he was called as pastor to St. Peter's, Edon and Grace Edgemoor, Ohio. A native of southeastern Pennsylvania, Rev. Good served as a private in the First Infantry Div. in World War II and from this experience received his call to serve Our Lord.

On May 10 Pastor and Mrs. Good and their two sons occupied the parsonage.

After the organization of the congregation on April 27, 1958, Pastor Good and Harry Shirley, general contractor, began work on choosing from various plans for a church that would meet the initial needs of the infant congregation. The plan which

was designed by Pastor Schalkhauser was unanimously accepted by the congregation and work on the church started the first part of July.

Under the capable direction of James Teach, church school superintendent and married teachers of the church school has grown to 88 members. Active church groups include the Women of the Church and the Luther League, organized in March.

The church Vestry includes: Phillip O'Herron, president; James Teach, vice president; Edwin Walek, church clerk; Bert Cox, treasurer; and Mrs. Stanley Nielsen, recording secretary. Deacons are Arthur Gamble and Robert White and Trustees are Fred Hartwig, Donald Otto and Stanley Croft.

P.P. Lutheran To Break Ground Sun.

Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, worshipping temporarily in Woodlute School on Peppermint Road, plans to break ground this Sunday for the first unit of an extensive long-range building program, according to the Rev. Carl E. Mehl, pastor.

The first unit, which will eventually be used as parish house and educational building, will be located on Newmarket Road off Twelve Mile and Farmington Roads next to O. E. Dunker Junior High, and will seat nearly 500.

Within the decade the congregation plans to erect an eight-room grade school and a final church building, seating 650 and including a chapel for private baptisms, weddings, and funerals.

The congregation has almost three acres of property fronting along Twelve Mile Road. Plans to utilize a good portion of it for off-street parking. This first church building to be erected in the Kendallwood subdivisions is the outgrowth of ten months' work in establishment of a Lutheran congregation in this area. The first service was held on March 30 of this year with an average attendance of 50 during April. Attendance now runs an average of 120. The Sunday School started with an enrollment of 32 and now numbers 63.

The ground-breaking service at general contractor, began work at approximately 11:45 a.m., November 23, following the registration morning worship service.

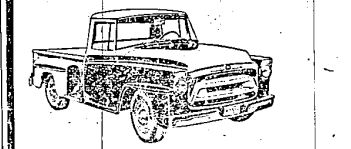
