Detroit Edison builds for the future—To meet the demands for more and more electricity, Edison is continually expanding and improving its facilities, On October 20 the third steam turbine-generator at the River Rouge Power Plant went into operation. This new 321,500-kilowatt unit brings the eapacity of Edison's electrical system to nearly 3½ million kilowatts. And there is more to come. Two new 325,000-kw. turbine-generators are being ladded to the St. Clair Power Plant—one in 1959 and the other in 1961. Both are forward-looking projects to permit Edison to supply power in any amount, large or small, to any of its one and a quarter million customers anywhere in its service area.

Modern living is electric living—Those things which make yesterday's dream home today's reality are electric. New conforts, conveniences, work savers are built right in when homes go ip.
