Falcons Score 276 Points, Hold Eight Opponents to 46

Final statistics released by the athletic department, last week tell a complete story in capsule form of the Farmington Falcons' outstanding success on the gridiron this season.

In eight contests, the mighty 1958 Falcons scored a total of 42 touchdowns and 276 points while holding their opponents to seven touchdowns and a meager 46 points. Three of these opponents were held scoreless while three others were able to push over only lone touchdowns against the stellar defensive squad. Computed out, this means that the Falcons averaged 34.5 points a game while holding their foes to less than six points per combat.

Leading ground gainer on the squad was Mike Agee who picked up 770 yards on 98 carries for an average of eight yards per try. Following him were Harvey Chapman and Neil Stevenson who both reeled off more than 400 yards. Chapman romped 442 yards in the 34 times he had the ball for a phenomenal 13 yard-per-try average. Carrying 85 times, Stevenson racked up 471 yards for a 7.2 per-try average.

Leading TD scorers were Chapman and Stevenson with nine apiece. Chapman went way out in front in total points scored by virtue of his success in booting points after touchdowns. On 34 attempts he was successful 25 times, boosting his total to 70 points scored. Close behind these two in the touchdown parade were Allen LeSage and Agee with eight and seven TDs, respectively.

A tribute to the strong defensive play of the Falcons is given in the data on fumbles. Note that on 36 occasions ball-carriers to fumble and then capitalized on them by recovering 24.

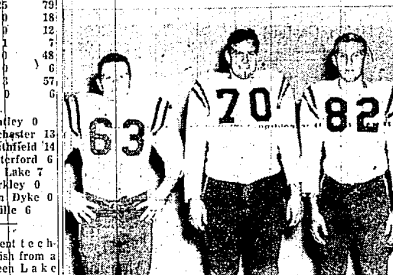

Approximately 60 basketball hopefuls turned out last Thursday for initial basketball drills at Farmington High. From this group will be molded both varsity and junior varsity squads. Awefire Worries

A sharp increase in numbers of the alewife in Lakes Michigan and Huron has biologists fearing a fish population explosion according to the National Wildlife Federation. Four years ago, no mention of the alewife was noted in Michigan records. In 1951, 25,493 pounds were taken from Lakes Michigan and Huron. The alewife is a member of the herring family and resides the Great Lakes from salt water. It has little or no sport or commercial value and may become a nuisance problem.

Pontiac School Wants in League
