One Arrest on Pit Operation, Trial Is Dec. 2
Township officials during the last week saw two definite actions taken in their fight against abuses of the zoning ordinance so far as top soil removal and gravel pits are concerned. Supervisor Frank Stephenson said Wednesday morning signed a complaint for removal of top soil without a permit against William Lewis. A WARRANT was issued and within an hour Police Chief Irving Yakes had arrested Lewis and brought him in. He pleaded not guilty to the charge, and trial was set by Judge Allen G. Ingle for Dec. 2. Township officials say Mr. Lewis had been operating on the southeast corner of the Middlebelt and 12 Mile intersection, and that he had never gotten a permit or posted bond as required. Otherwise his operation, they said, appeared to be entirely legal. Trucking Company was stopped from their operation last week by a restraining order from the court. US-16 Safety Selling Point
The Farmington-Brighton expressway is one of 11 in the state which is being used to study increased safety brought about by the controlled access roadways. These 11 expressway sections by-pass 17 communities. Information given at the 11/2-M expressway hearing here last week was that on a section of the 23-mile Farmington-Brighton expressway, which is being reported on the old route during the first three months of 1957. THIS COMPARED with 19 accidents during the first three months of this year. This week the Michigan Good Roads Federation reported that the 147 miles of expressways just studied enabled 14 per cent more traffic to be served. They reduced the fatalities to 100 per 100 million vehicles, by more than two-thirds, the number of fatal accidents by more than one-half, and the total number of accidents was reduced by more than one-quarter. This study was for a six-month period, and was said the most complete comparison of "before and after" data, in which the "old route" is compared with the "new route" with complete access control. The Federation thinks the 147 miles of expressways now in operation saved 25 lives.

Blind Aid Seals Return Starts
Some scattered returns are already coming in from the first mailings of Blind Aid Seals by the Farmington Lions Club, according to Arthur Ralston, chairman of this year's campaign. It is too early, of course, to tell what the complete response will be, but the need is great. THE DRIVE is conducted annually by the Lions to raise funds for the Michigan Blind Children's Home. This service is made available to pupils in both the public and parochial schools. "Theme of this year's campaign is "Be Thankful You Can See." None of the money raised from sale of the seals is used for administrative purposes.

Expressway Interchange Points Nuclei of Future Development
"The areas adjacent to the programmed expressways, and especially their interchanges, will be the nuclei for the 'communities of tomorrow.'" Dr. Frank W. Suggitt has reported to the Michigan Good Roads Federation. Suggitt, head of the Department of Resource Development at Michigan State University, said that the expressways and the necessary interchanges will mark the most favorable sites in which to locate Michigan's fast growing residential, industrial, commercial and recreational expansion. "A number of major expressway interchanges can be identified for a major economic growth," Suggitt said, "since they represent intersections of the expressway with expressways." He said these include the areas in the vicinity of Detroit, Ann Arbor, Jackson, Kalamazoo, Benton Harbor, Muskegon, Grand Rapids, Lansing, Flint and Bay City. Suggitt said that the so-called rural areas especially in the vicinity of Grand Rapids, Flatrock, Marshall, Brighton, and Benton, are significant in that these sites mark "entirely new nuclei for the development of commercial and business activities." The interchange areas where the expressways meet general roadways must be anticipated in order to adequately plan for the future, he said, "can expect new increased economic growth, design."
