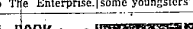

The Oakland County Health Department is an official, tax supported agency serving a county population of about 618,000.

It was established in 1926 and was the first county health unit

The clinic services, immunizations, mass surveys, screening procedures in schools and communities; the sanitation

Health department programs are carried on by a medical, nursing, sanitation, nutritionist, laboratory and clerical staff. The public nurses and sanitarians are frequently referred to

The "field staff" since most of their time is spent in their assigned areas. Clinic services are maintained in the Central and South Oakland Offices. The Laboratory service is maintained at the Central office of the Health Dept. Consultant service is obtained from the Michigan State Department of Health.

The Health Department is one of ten health departments in Michigan accredited as field placement agencies and is eligible to receive public health students from universities within and outside the State of Michigan.
