Now Dressing Dolls

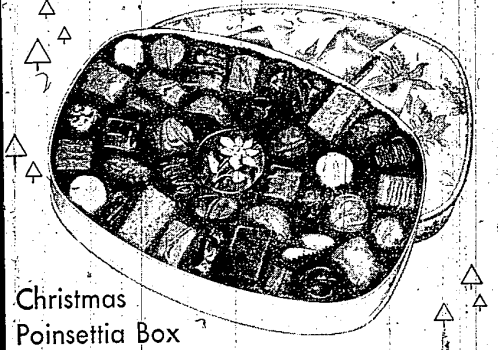
Through the beginning months
