Christmas Tree Fire Hazards Can Be Reduced

Seven ways to reduce the fire hazard of Christmas trees have been listed by State Fire Marshal Glenroy M. Walker. They are: 1. Buy a tree that is as fresh as possible and keep it in the shade to which it was cut. Such a tree will retain its moisture to be set up. Use a standard which will contain water and fill the container with water. This will keep the tree green and moist and reduce flammability.
