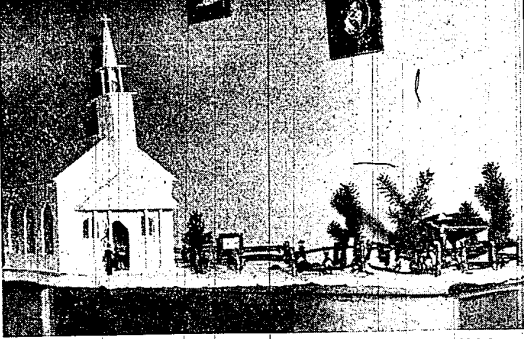

MANY CHRISTMAS scenes are being put up in homes throughout the area these days but probably none have required more time or artistic ability than the one on display at the Herb L. Orman home at 21629 Walden Street.
It is a church scene, complete with miniature people, trees and an outdoor crib scene.
The really unusual portion of the display is the church itself. It is made completely out of a mixture of egg whites and powdered sugar. Building the church required nearly two months of work. Each section of the building had to be rolled out and allowed to dry slowly before being set into place.
The church stands 24 inches high from the ground to the top of the steeple. It is approximately 12 inches wide and 13 inches deep.
Each year the Ormans expand the scene. This year a tiny altar has been placed in the church, complete with altar cloth and other altar linens. Those tiny articles were made by Mrs. Maria Himmel-spach, 83-year-old mother of Joseph Himmel-spach who came to this country less than a year ago from Hungary.
Also added to the scene this year was the outdoor crib scene and music piped into the church.
Mr. Orman is employed as a chef at Himmel-spach's Restaurant.

America Has Done A Lot For St. Nick
It's little wonder that Saint Nick is especially generous to the American people. History proves that the Americans have done a lot for St. Nick.
According to Donald Luggin, editor of the Holiday articles in the World Book Encyclopedia, the Americans have given Saint Nick a new name, a new face and figure, and a new means of transportation.
The original European version of Saint Nick was a tall, angular man who rode on a bony, gray mare. Both the horse and Saint Nick looked as if they hadn't had a good meal in some time. The Saint had deep sunk eyes, and wore a flowing, threadbare cloak and a black skullcap.
The early English settlers in this country started giving Saint Nicholas his "New Look." The English children adopted the legendary Christmas figure from the Dutch, but they had trouble pronouncing "Saint Nicholas." Somehow the name changed to "Santa Claus" and finally to "Santa Claus."
However, this was only the beginning. In 1809 Washington Irving, in his "Knickerbocker's story of New York," wrote of the city as the guardian of New York City. Irving described Saint Nick as a jolly fellow with a broom in his hand and a bag of goodies. He taught Saint Nick to smoke a long pipe, and in the story, replaced his shuffling air-burner with a trim white horse-tail.
A short time later, Saint Nicholas' transformation was aided by Clement Moore in his famous poem, "The Visit from Saint Nicholas," written in 1822. Moore, a professor of Divinity in an New York Theological Seminary, gave Saint Nick a sleigh, twinkling eyes, cheeks like roses, nose like a cherry, and a round little belly.
Today's Santa Claus is by no means streamlined, but he is a far cry from the lean, ascetic, somberly dressed fellow of centuries, on Christmas Eve, he guided his mare through the streets of Europe.
