Sale of Auto Plates Still Running Slow

Local Secretary of State Branch Office Manager Gerald Grace reported this week that license plate sales continue to run slow, indicating another last minute rush and long waiting lines.

This year the problem will be even greater than in past years during the closing days since owners are being required to fill out their own application blanks.

The move to have individuals fill out their own forms was taken as an economy measure. Secretary of State officials said it will save the state approximately \$250,000.

Application blanks can be picked up at any time at all branch offices and filled out at home with the license plate purchase made later. It was emphasized they should be filled out in black ink letters or typed.

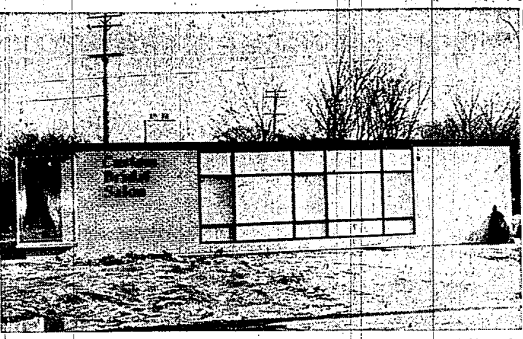
All vehicle owners are also reminded that they must bring their car titles with them to complete the registration process when getting plates.

AAA Motor News Describes Changes at Saratoga Farms

One of the Farmington attractions—Saratoga Farms—is described in the December issue of Motor News, the AAA magazine, under the column "Dining 'n' Michigan."

After directions on how to get here, the article reads:

ASSUME YOU are running an AAA-approved restaurant with good food at reasonable prices in a nice atmosphere. It's in a white colonial building at the top of a hill on US-16 about four miles west of Farmington. You're doing a nice business and many of the motorists who drive from Detroit to Lansing stop on the way.

Then a four-lane divided expressway opens crossing US-16 one and a quarter miles east of you and siphons off most of the Detroit-Lansing traffic from your front door. How do you get anyone to journey off the main route and eat at your place?

ROSE MARCHESOTTI, owner of Saratoga Farms, is solving the problem. She maintains her high food quality, serves generous cocktails and has lowered

her prices. The result is that she has a good business with motorists who look like a bargain, but she could use more.

We had eaten at Saratoga a number of times after football games at East Lansing over the last nine years it's been open. So we decided in September to look in on it for the first time since the expressway opened.

OLD US-16 is a dark highway now, with many of the commercial establishments which catered to motorists closed. It's almost like you were attending a wake when suddenly on the top of a hill Rose's place glows white. And it hasn't changed except it's not so crowded now.

The AAA story then goes on to describe the building and the prices for various specialties. Saratoga Farms is closed now, as usual during the holidays, but will reopen in a few weeks.

X-way West One-Third Done

Approximately one-third of the 165-mile Detroit-Sturgeon expressway following the general line of U.S. 16 between the two cities on opposite sides of the state is now open to traffic, a year-end highway department report disclosed.

The three sections now opened to traffic are: Farmington-Brighton, 22.6 miles; Coopersville to Marne in Ottawa county, 10 miles; Portland to Hastings in Ionia county, 16.5 miles. Under construction and scheduled for opening this year is 13.3 mile section from Hastings road westerly to Cascade in Kent county.

Still to be let on the interstate route are 10.6 miles of roadway and structures at an estimated cost of \$71,769,000.
