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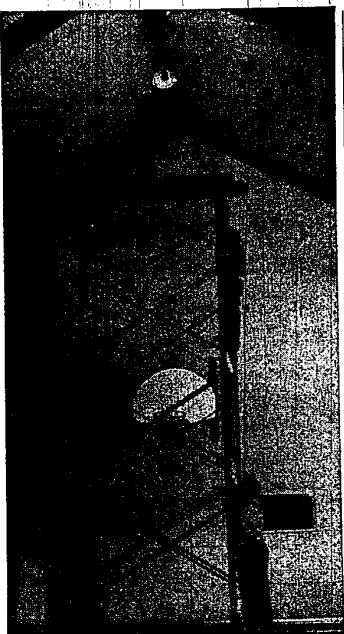

Timely Tips on GARDENING

TREE CARE—Trees need an annual application of fertilizer and now, as the ground is thawing, is a good time to feed them. Poke a ring of holes in the ground beneath the outer tips of the branches. Make these about three feet apart, and about eighteen inches deep and fill them with dry fertilizer that is high in nitrogen. If it has not yet been done, remove broken branches and do any pruning needed to improve the shape of the tree. If the crown is larger than the size of the trunk, it should be pruned.

TREES FOR SPRING PLANTING—Most trees can be planted with equal success in Spring and Fall, but thin-barked trees should be moved only in the Spring. If they are moved in the Fall, root growth is limited and the trees do not become well established before winter weather comes. Severe frost cracks the thin bark easily and the tree succumbs if it is not well established. Trees that should be planted in the Spring include dogwood, birch, beech, flowering peach and Japanese maple.

REMEMBERS—Make garden plans on paper. Order vegetable and flower seeds. If it has not been done recently take soil samples and have them tested for acidity and nutritional deficiencies. Feed lawns.
