## 150 Sr. High-Several Jr. High, Elementary Science, Art Projects Displayed at C'ville

A record number turned out to the hall. There was so much interest shown that the following exhibition, which was held at the Clarencville Junior High school, was made up of 100 student projects from the high school, not including those of the Clarencville district which included the four elementary schools, the junior high and the senior high.

This was the third annual exhibition of the Clarencville Junior High School. Each student received an exhibit ribbon for entering a project. First, second and third place awards were also given in each division.

**2 Place Second In Forensics**

The 1958-59 District Forensics Contest was held at Clarencville Junior High on Saturday, April 11, from 9:30 a.m. till 2:30 p.m.

Various schools who participated were West Bloomfield, Brighton, Clarkston, Northville, Walled Lake Junior High, Pontiac, Grady Junior High, Howell, and Clarencville.

There were five divisions: humorous, declamation, extemporaneous, interpretive, reading, and original oratory. Winners from Clarencville were Barbara Watwood, who placed second in the humorous division, and Russell Lawrence, who placed second in declamation. Honorable mention was given to Judy Bailey, Leo Baldwin, and Tom Ripaldi. Second place winners go on to the Regional contests.

At the high school level, the projects were divided into four categories: biology, chemistry, physics and general science. Each student received an exhibit ribbon for entering a project. First, second and third place awards were also given in each division.

**THE BIOLOGY division.** First place award was taken by Ralph Allen with his project demonstrating plant tropisms; second place, Martha Spencer, effects of hormones on plant growth; and third place, Forrest Fennell, nutrition experiments with white rats.

**THE CHEMISTRY section.** First award went to Donald Fulghum, etching of printed circuits; second, Merton Roberts, titration experiments to show acid content of fruit juices; and third, Karen Chappell, electrical conductivity of various solutions.

**THE PHYSICS category.** First award was taken by Kenneth Stitz with his Winburn electro-static machine, which was constructed almost entirely of hand-made plastic and metal parts; second, Bob Leeds with his fluid flow demonstration apparatus; third, Paul Horton, frequency counter connected to a tape recorder.
