Orchard Meth. Building Fund Drive A Success
A three day church building fund drive conducted by the Orchard Methodist Church was concluded in victory last Tuesday, April 21.
Using 24 teams of two members each, the church solicited more than the \$25,000 needed to meet the initial goal of its building fund drive.
"JUST AS soon as we can sell our present sanctuary, a former factory building on 12 Mile Road, just east of Orchard Lake Road, at somewhere near the asking price of \$20,000, we will be ready to break ground on the new structure on Farmington Road near 14 Mile, Reverend Frank Cozadd, minister, said.
In addition to the monies raised by the building fund drive and the money expected from sale of the old church, more is expected in special offerings coming from other churches.
ORCHARD METHODIST Church was designated as "Church of the Year" recently by the Detroit Conference of Methodist Church. As such, it is expected that the church will receive up to \$18,000 in special offerings.
The special offerings will be taken up in each church of the Conference on Methodist Union Sunday.
