The addition of a star to old Elks' Union on July 4, representing the new State of Alaska, will be the first change in the flag since 1912, when New Mexico and Arizona became the 47th and 48th States. A fiftieth star, for the State of Hawaii, is soon to be added.

Madigan also urged all citizens of Farmington to fly the new stars to Old Glory's firm colors before their homes and meet, let us resolve to remain places of business on June 14. This year's Flag Day will principles symbolized by those stars and stripes.

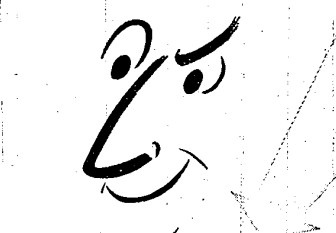
