Cawley Takes 3 Firsts in AAU Meet

Farmington High track sensation Warren (Rex) Cawley is continuing to pile up more track honors in national competition.

A week ago Saturday in Chicago he showed winning form in both the high and low hurdles and the 440 yard hurdles.

Last Saturday Cawley races to another triple victory in hurdle events, in the Midwest AAU meet at Fort Wayne, Indiana. Included among the top college competition he was running against was former Michigan star Joel McNulty.

Cawley took the 120 yard high in a time of 1:42 in a field of strong competitors. His winning time in the 220 yard low hurdles was 2:33. This is a time ten-tenths of a second better than the Big Ten record.

His third victory came in the 440 yard hurdles. His time was 5:15 seconds.

Cawley's times qualify him to compete in the National AAU meet in Boulder, Colorado, June 19 and 20. If he continues his usual form here he will be going on to the compete in the Pan American Games and the Russian-United States Track Meet.
