Speculating in Stocks?

In our area, and all over the nation, speculation in common stocks has reached alarming levels. But advice is something many people simply won't take. They know someone who has made a killing.

Prices of common stocks have gone up and up over the last year and a half. Lately there have been a few hesitant periods, a few drops. We're not predicting a stock market collapse, but we know there are some common sense rules the amateur ought to follow.

Cheap stocks need a lot more study

than higher priced stocks. Any common stock selling at 15 or less should not be bought on just a tip or a hunch. A few of these will go on to good earnings. By far the most, however, will never get off the ground. A high priced stock is not nec-

ground. A nigh priced stock is not nec-essarily expensive.

There's one rule you should always follow. If any stranger phones you writes you, or wires you that he's going to make you rich just because he can't bear to see you struggling along without a fortune—and a few hundred shares of stock he is touting—ignore him. Don't send him any money. Don't be a sucker.

If anyone tells you to buy a certain

If anyone tells you to buy a certain stock right away before the price gets away from you, always take time to check. There's no rush. Securities marketslare open five days a week, and reputable brokerage offices are always available.

The last couple of years have found a much, much larger portion of our population investing in common stocks. Labor unions to the contrary, more and more amons to the contary, more and more paid up much of their installment buying, and are investing spare cash in stocks. The muthal funds have helped this by their aggressive salesmanship. This is all to the good, providing the money is spent for investments, not uncontrolled specu-lation in cheap stocks.

We can not repeat too often: don't act on tips of rumors! It's not too difficult or time consuming to make your own studies. Those who act on tips from friends often lose the friend plus their


