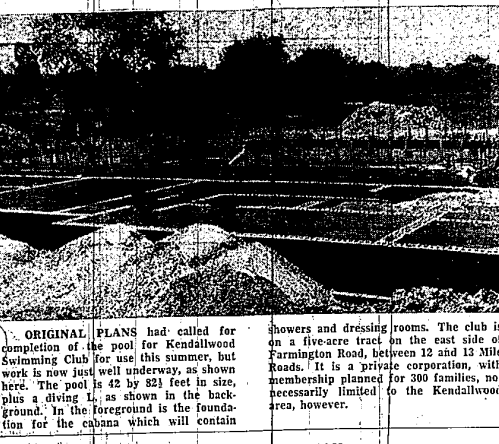
B. Land Purchase. Offer to sell property at 23611 Liberty Street to the City was discussed and the Council decided not to purchase by unanimous consent.
