Mike Weber, the flash of the League posted his fifth win against no losses and collected his 11th home run of the season which is a new little League record.

THE YANKEES scored the first runs of the game in the first inning with Kelly Burke hitting his third home run of the season. Bill Freeman then singled and Stan Cook doubled with the ball getting away from the left fielder allowing Freeman to score. Cook then singled scoring Cook to give the Yankees their only runs of the game.

The Cards out the lead 3 to 2 when Weber was safe on an error Mike Wall singled, Rick Manross was safe on a fielders choice with Weber out at third. Both runners scoring on Joe Winders double.

WEBER's teammates went to town in the bottom of the ninth scoring 6 runs on 4 hits with Joe Oddy walking to lead off. Bob Svaboda singled, Tom Maybarger doubled, scoring Oddy and Mike Weber was intentionally passed to lead the bases. With Mike Wall at bat, Bob Svaboda stole home and Wall was walked to load the bases again. Rick Manross then singled scoring Maybarger and Weber.

With two out, Wes Hanson was safe on an error which again loaded the bases. Joe Oddy then singled scoring Wall and Manross to give the Cards an 8 to 3 lead.

IN THE TOP of the third inning Stan Cook singled for the 6th and last hit off of Card pitcher Mike Weber who retired the next 11 men to face him.

In the bottom of the third the Cards scored two runs without the benefit of a hit. They scored their last four runs in the fourth inning after two were out. Bob Svaboda singled, Tom Maybarger was safe on an error, Joe Cranson singled scoring Svaboda. Weber then hit his 11th home run of the season for the final score of the game. Losing pitcher was Mike Bars.

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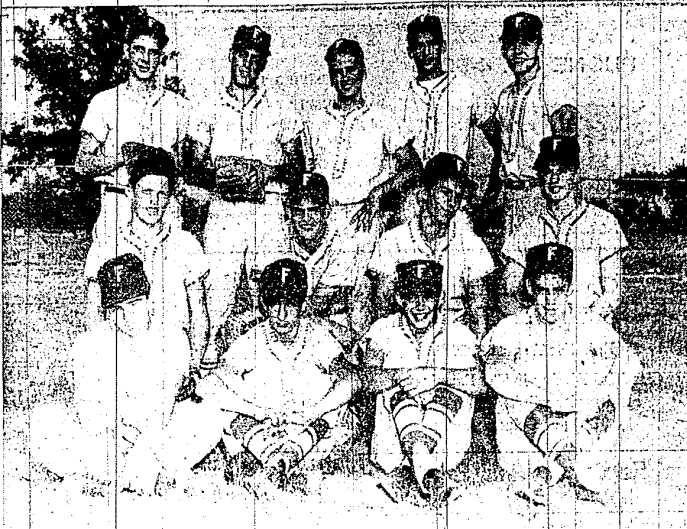

Tuesday, July 13, the Red Sox edged the Giants 6-5. John Fulton and Dennis Berling combined to check the Giants with two hits, both by Mike Tidler.

Wednesday, July 15, when they defeated the Giants 6-3. Tommy Thomas picked up his fifth win of the season as his mates, led by Joe Jentzer with 2 for 4, beat the giant hurler Bob Lord for the loss.

On Thursday, July 16, the Red Sox beat on a rampage to blank the Dodgers 18-8. Dennis Berling (3 for 4), Cameron Auld (2 for 4), and Rick McLaw (2 for 1), led the 17 hit attack on Dodger pitcher, Don Davis. Cameron Auld went all the way to pick up the win.

Plenty of Park Area Just 30 Minutes Away

Have you ever thought about taking a late afternoon or early evening drive to Kensington Metropolitan Park, go for a swim and then spread your supper out on one of the rustic picnic tables?

Just such an outing for the entire family can be fun at Kensington Metropolitan Park, 4,600 acre recreational site which is a unit of the Huron Clinton Metropolitan Authority, located on the Grand River Expressway (US 16) near Brighton.

According to David Laidlaw, park manager, the park is much closer in miles or minutes of driving time than most people realize.

He pointed out that persons living in the Grand River and Eight Mile Road area in Detroit are but a 20-minute drive from the park by traveling on US 16, the Grand River Expressway.

Available are swimming area, at Monticello and Maple beaches, modern beach houses with food bars, dressing rooms, clothes and valuable checking and laundry and first aid facilities.

With a qualified lifeguard staff of up to 14 guards on duty and swimming permitted daily until dusk.

Other facilities include boat rental service until 10 p.m., boat launching and dockage, fishing, a nature center, nature trails and camping for organized youth groups but no family camping is available. The park is open daily from daylight to 11 p.m. An outstanding feature at the park is a tour of Kent Lake on the "Island Queen", 60 passenger stern-wheel excursion boat which makes 45 minute trips around the lake starting at noon until the final trip starts at 8 p.m. on Tuesdays through Sundays, with an additional trip starting at 7 p.m. on Sundays.
