

Final Bob-Lo Trip Friday

The Farmington summer recreation program will be concluded this Friday when children from the four northern area playgrounds take the annual Bob-Lo excursion. Buses will load at each of the playgrounds—Ten Mile, Bond, Eagle and Woodville school—at 8 a.m., and travel to Detroit to board the 10 a.m. Bob-Lo boat. Tickets for the trip are 75c for children 12 years of age and under and \$1.50 for those over this age. In addition, there is a 10c charge to get on the island. Children are also requested to bring their own spending money for amusement park attractions and their own lunches. Parents are invited to take the trip with their children, recreation program director Warren Piche stated. Approve Higher Frequency PAs

New public address systems, with higher frequencies than previously authorized, will be provided at four elementary schools in the Farmington district as the result of rescinding action taken by the School Board Monday night. The Board decided on the change to the higher frequency range systems in view of the fact that the additional cost for all four schools would be only a little over \$200.00. The systems will be installed in the Bond, Eagle, Shiawassee and Gill Road schools. Total cost will be \$6,640.50.

Sewer Joining Interest High

There is quite a lot of interest in the township already in connecting to the Farmington sewer, with the main line now being constructed. Clerk Floyd A. Cairns reported Tuesday night to the board he had about a dozen requests now on his desk. THE BOARD received a request from residents in the Tuck Road and 8 Mile area, which was referred to study. There are a couple of trailer parks in that territory. In another action concerning the sewer the board joined two areas in Franklin Knolls, one of which had earlier been approved, to simplify application to the Michigan Securities Commission. Bonding for the combined areas would run to about \$100,000.

Father Vigneau Dies in Europe

Father Ralph Joseph Vigneau, assistant pastor at Our Lady of Sorrows Church here from the fall of 1955 until the summer of 1958, died last week at the age of 44 in Brussels while on a European vacation. For the past three years Father Vigneau had been chaplain at Rosary High School. He also served as an assistant pastor at St. David's in Detroit, the Shrine of the Little Flower in Royal Oak and Sacred Heart in Grosse Ile. Father Vigneau had left June 22 with a fellow priest with whom he had been ordained on May 18, 1940. Only two days remained of the European trip during which Father Vigneau had fulfilled a lifelong ambition of visiting Lourdes and Rome.

Completes Navy Officer Course

Scheduled to Graduate July 24 from the Navy's officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island was Navy Ensign Jerry C. Burt, son of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth L. Burt of 20912 Colwell Ave., Farmington. Ensign Burt is a graduate of Wayne State University in Detroit. He was among 363 college graduates and outstanding personnel from the fleet to complete the 18 weeks of training in Naval Sciences. The new officers heard the honorable Richard Jackson, Assistant Secretary of the Navy (Personnel and Reserve Forces) as guest speaker at graduation ceremonies. The graduates will assume a variety of assignments, including duty aboard ship, or training as Naval Aviators.
