Rep. Broomfield Irlked at Cost Of Extra Crops

The Federal government is paying out \$3,500,000 a day just to store a growing mountain of surplus farm crops, complains William Broomfield, 18th District representative in the House of Representatives, from Oakland county.

The cost for storage and handling alone of some \$12 billion worth of surplus crops, by 1963 will reach \$4,000,000 a day unless steps are taken to stop over-production, Broomfield warns.

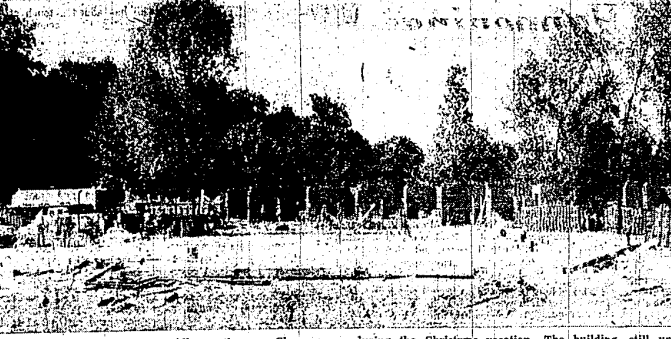
EARLIER this year, Broomfield sponsored a bill in the House to do away with farm subsidies and price supports. The bill also outlined an orderly program going away with nearly \$9 billion worth of surplus farm produce now being stored at government expense.

"Congress has failed to cope with our farm problem, which is growing worse by the minute," he said. "The increasing efficiency in farm production makes present control programs even more unrealistic," he added.

Grocer Directs Home For Mentally Retarded

Harry Brenner, 48, is known locally as the owner and operator of Brenner's Farmington Hills market near the corner of 10 Mile and Orchard Lake Roads.

In Romeo up near Mt. Clemens, and elsewhere throughout the state, he is known in considerably different circles. He's active in Michigan's program for aiding mentally retarded children.

The man who previously operated the Ann Arbor home had been convicted of cruelty to the children boarded in the home. And when the previous owner was discharged, the patients there were threatened with the loss of their home.

Seals Protect Wooden Floors

There are no varnished floors in most modern homes. Jessie Marion, home furnishings extension specialist at Michigan State University, says penetrating wood seals have taken over the job of protecting wood floors.

Many different floor seals are available, but they can be divided into three types. First type is the seal which penetrates deeply into the wood like and oil finish. It is a thin liquid and requires many applications to build up a protective finish. It also requires a filler for open grain woods such as oak.

It would seem a far cry from being a grocer to being an advisor and active participant in mental health. But Brenner has good reason for leading two lives, both of them seemingly removed from each other.

THE TWO novices to the mental health problem consulted with professionals in the field to gain an understanding. Brenner advocated that high-priced professionals were not necessary in the operation of such a home as he had in mind—one where the patients were supervised and treated equally in a calm home-like atmosphere.

Second type of seal penetrates into the pores of the wood and hardens level with the surface. Generally, no filler is required. Two or three coats of seal will protect the floor.

The third type has a varnish base and forms a surface coating. This finish quickly shows marks and scratches.

As a result of their studies, the two men established themselves in Ann Arbor with a staff of non-professional workers, whose job was to care for and supervise the children.

After two years in Ann Arbor, Brenner and Saks moved to another home in Romeo, Mich., where they continued to rent. That was in 1952. Then in 1953 they bought the home in Romeo.

Miss Marion prefers the second type of seal—one which penetrates and dries level with the floor. This finish is easy to apply and it is easy to patch. Worn areas can be redone so they blend with the original floor finish—something you can't do with varnish.

To get the type of seal you want, read labels. Directions for applying are your clue to which type of seal it is.

Good results were quick to be apparent. Children in the home were considerably more content and tended period of time than they had been in their respective family homes.

BRENNER observed that in an atmosphere where everyone was equal and where there were no outside pressures—such as from unknown normal youngsters—the retarded children became quieter and more at ease with themselves.

Some took up gardening with little or no urging. Others showed no signs of unruly tempers that predominated their lives "on the outside."

ABOUT 1950 Harry became acquainted with another Detroit, Harry Saks, who also had a mentally retarded child. Saks shared Brenner's views on the care of mentally deficient children.

Together they set out to establish a home which was more along their own lines of thought and in which they could be assured their two children would be properly accommodated.

SINCE THAT day in 1952 when he re-located in Romeo, Brenner estimates that "Haven Farm," as it is named, has cared for more than 50 mentally retarded children.

They needed a home for retarded children near Ann Arbor. They had no trouble receiving a license from the state.

Brenner's son Larry is one of the charter members of Haven Farm. He enjoys gardening there and delights in keeping the acre and one-half of lawn neat and tidy. Larry and some of his companions at the home occasionally go to a movie in downtown Romeo, only a few minutes walk from the farm.
