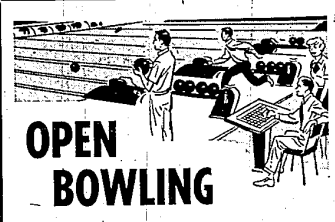

Falcon, OLS Athletes Must Take Physicals

Coaches at the Farmington high school and also Our Lady of Sorrows put out a call this week for all hopeful athletes who intend to compete in any interscholastic sport during 1959.

Purpose of the call: Compulsory physical examinations.

Once again, a battery of local doctors will conduct physical examinations in the Farmington high school gymnasium where all athletes may be examined virtually at one time.

Potential competitors must understand and pass, this physical check before being eligible for the various sports programs during the coming year.

THIS year, the physicals will be given on Thursday, August 27, starting at 9 a.m. The tests will be for all hopeful athletes in grades seven through 12 from both junior and senior Farmington high schools plus Our Lady of Sorrows.

This one-for-all physical exam next Thursday will avoid having to send a large group of athletes out for a physical each time a new sports season arrives, explained Jack Cotton, Farmington high school director.

The examining doctors will charge a nominal fee of \$1 for each youngster, Cotton said.

Gridders, Parents Meet Coaches Wed.

Candidates for Farmington high school's varsity football team this fall will kick-off the 1959 season with a parent-player-coach meeting Wednesday evening, Aug. 26.

The meeting, scheduled to begin at 7 p.m., will be held at the Farmington high school cafeteria.

Purpose of the informal meeting is to permit coaches to explain training and the rules governing it to discuss where the responsibility lies pertaining to injury incurred in a game or scrimmage, available insurance covering such injuries, and similar points of interest.

AT LEAST one parent must accompany each candidate at this meeting, said Jack Cotton, Farmington high school athletic director. This will assure the coaching staff of an opportunity to meet parents and discuss with them the various points of interest.

The Falcons' football team will open its practice sessions on Aug. 31. Coach Jack Hayes will hold two practice sessions in the morning and another in the afternoon, until school begins on Sept. 10.

Starting then, the team will meet one day, five times a week. Uniforms and equipment will be issued from Aug. 28 until Aug. 31, it was announced.

Among the requirements for eligibility is a mandatory physical examination for each player. These physicals will be given at the Farmington high school gym all day Thursday, Aug. 27.

LAST FALL the Falcons shaped a perfect record with eight wins in as many outings. Enroute the locals scored 276 points as compared to 46 by their opponents. The Falcons captured the Inter-Lakes conference title and were ranked seventh in the state in Class "A" circles by the Associated Press.

THE TIGERS collected five hits and seven walks off the Yankees' hurlers. Big blow was a triple by McArts. D. Mills, S. Kraft, R. Benninger, and B. Caie each hit singles.

The Tigers' capture of the championship was a fitting tribute to Tim McArts, Sr., who was serving his last year as manager of the team. In the three years at the North Farmington Little League he has been in existence, McArts' Tigers have been runners-up twice.

New Trojan Grid Coach Confident

New head football coach at Clareneville high school this fall will be Lynn Nutter.

Nutter, who for the past three seasons has been an assistant grid mentor on the Trojans' coaching staff.

A graduate of Fairmont State Teachers college in West Virginia, Nutter takes over the reins of the Clareneville varsity at a time when the Trojans' football fortunes are at a low ebb.

Last season, the Trojans managed only a 1-7 record and seventh-place in the eight-member W. Y. C. Oakland-Southfield League.

Three regulars from the 1958 squad will return as the backbone of the current team.

Despite the mediocre showing of a year ago, Nutter displays confidence and enthusiasm as he approaches his first season as boss of the Clareneville gridders.

"I'm looking forward to a very successful season," Nutter proclaimed.

"I'll be counting heavily on the sophomores and juniors," he added to the new head coach. He indicated that the junior varsity team of last year should provide ample talent to build a strong varsity squad this autumn.

The Trojans, who open the regular schedule on Sept. 18 against Ypsilanti Lincoln, will begin practice sessions Monday, Aug. 31. Nutter said that equipment issue and locker assignments will be handled on Saturday, Aug. 29, from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.

The players must have taken their mandatory physical examinations prior to the first day of practice. Nutter said that practices daily until school begins on Sept. 10. From then on the Trojans will meet once a day.

Nutter, who lives in Livonia, told of plans to have a parent-player-coach meeting toward the end of September when things have been worked into a firm routine.
