Ask Easement Use For Bowling Parking Developers of the new Bel-Aire bowling alley have asked the city to allow use of some of the greenbelt easement for a blacktopping to expand parking in that area. 3rd Largest Peach Crop

The state's estimated peach crop is the third largest in the nation, and is about the same size as the 1958 harvest. HARVESTING of nearly all fruiting this year was a week to two weeks ahead of normal, according to the Michigan Department of Agriculture. Peaches were no exception. The peak of the Michigan peach harvest is about the same around Labor Day, but the situation is changed. The season may be concluded soon after mid-September. In past years the harvest often did not begin until after Sept. 1.

ISABEL HAYNES, Clerk AMENDMENT NO. 1 ARTICLE 11 - DEFINITIONS SECTION 201 - UNPLATTED LANDS - SECTION 501 Add - Essential services: The phrase "essential services" means the erection, alteration or maintenance by public utilities or municipal departments or commissions of underground or overhead gas, electrical, steam, or water transmission or distribution systems, collection, communication, supply or disposal systems, including to w e r s, poles, wires, and other appurtenances, including fire alarm boxes, police call boxes, traffic signals, hydrants, and other similar equipment and accessories in connection therewith, but not including buildings, structures or structures, the furnishing of adequate service by such public utilities or municipal departments or commissions for the public health or safety or general welfare.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 ARTICLE VI - SECTION 601 Add - Essential services shall be permitted as authorized and regulated by law and other ordinances of the Village of Farmington.

AMENDMENT NO. 3 ARTICLE IX - SECTION 904 Add -7. Permit the erection of buildings, structures or structures in addition to an existing building, of a public service corporation, or for public utility purposes, in any permitted district to a greater height or to a larger area than the district requirements here established, and permit the location in any use district of a public utility building, structure or use if the Board shall find such use, height, area, building or structure reasonably necessary for the public convenience and safety, and provided that such building, structure or use is designed, erected and land used to conform harmoniously with the general architecture and plan of such district.

Unplatted lands may be used for residential purposes, but not for farming, and for limited professional office or industrial building, other than those used in connection with the operation of a farm, which are erected or maintained thereon. In addition, unplatted lands may be used and occupied for the following purposes and uses upon approval of the Zoning Board of Appeals. In considering a request to use un-platted lands for any of such uses or purposes, the Zoning Board of Appeals shall consider the location of buildings upon the plot involved, the adequacy of parking facilities, routes of ingress and egress and such other factors which, in the opinion of the Zoning Board of Appeals are relevant in order that nuisance conditions may be prevented, fire congestion controlled, and the letter and spirit of this Ordinance upheld.

(a) Libraries and recreational facilities. (b) Churches and other facilities, normally incidental thereto. (c) Public, parochial and private elementary, intermediate and high schools affecting courses in general education, not operated for profit. (d) Municipal buildings and structures. (e) Automobile parking space.

(f) Public utility buildings, telephone exchange buildings, electric transformer stations and substations, and gas regulator stations when operation requirements necessitate the locating within the district in order to serve the immediate vicinity. (Aug. 20, 1959)

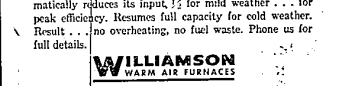
