Saturday Art Classes To Again be Offered

The Detroit Art Institute in cooperation with the Farmington public schools will again sponsor a series of art classes for the children of the Farmington area beginning Saturday, October 10.

The 1959 summer program attracted a total of 148 children here to record the second largest participation of the twelve communities that cooperated. Over 1038 registered in the total program, officials said.

The public is invited to see an exhibit of work from these classes opening at the galleries of the Detroit Art Institute on October 3. Children's work from the twelve metropolitan communities will be included.

The new series of classes will be held Saturdays at Farmington High School and will run for five weeks according to the following schedule:

Oct. 10 to Nov. 7, 5th and 6th grades in the morning and 1st and 2nd grades in the afternoon.

Nov. 14 to Dec. 19 (no class Oct. 3).

Registration for the new classes must be mailed prior to October 3.

It happens that a piece of property less than 10 acres in size in Farmington township is not a farm. And goats can only be raised on less than 10 acres if they don't create a nuisance.

That's what the township ordinance says.

Frank's land in only five acres in size. That's where the township caught up with him.

Furthermore, Judge Lawson ruled odorous goats are a nuisance.

One neighbor said that when the wind is just right: "where."

Township attorney Jos. T. Brennan presented the township's arguments last Wednesday, Sept. 23, before Judge Lawson. It was not known immediately whether Maviglia would appeal on behalf of his goats.
