Reception Held Sunday For Monsignor Beahan

Right Reverend Monsignor Thomas P. Beahan, D.D., seven years of the Archdiocese of Detroit raised to the rank of domestic prelate and chaplain, were formally invested with their robes last week.

The ceremony of investiture was conducted at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral in Detroit by the Most Rev. John P. Dear-den, archbishop of Detroit, before a jam-packed audience.

Sunday afternoon, Dec. 13, a reception was held for Monsignor Beahan, pastor of Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic parish, in the Sorrows High School auditorium.

Several were in attendance for the short program which was conducted and many others dropped in later in the afternoon to congratulate Monsignor Beahan.

Arrangements for the reception were made by Paul Korte and William Frank. In charge of refreshments was Mrs. John Mereshak.

Since Monsignor Beahan was pastor, a tremendous building program has been conducted. A large grade school and a convent (presently being used as a church) was built as well as a new 1200' student high school. Work is now underway on the corner of Shawneet and Power and should be ready for occupancy sometime next year.

Monsignor Beahan was ordained as a priest in 1936.

Traffic Safety Sabbath Comm. Picks Theme

Michigan's Inter-Faith Coordinating Committee, on Traffic Safety Sabbath, in cooperation with the State Safety Commission, today announced their Christmas Season safety campaign, "This Year Give Life!"

It stresses the moral responsibility of every driver upon our highways during this season of good will.

A special folder prepared by the committee points a finger at the individual driver who fails to follow the Golden Rule for one fleeting moment, may cause a tragedy never to be forgotten. Responsibility rests with the passengers, who may innocently, or through habit, momentarily divert the driver's attention, causing loss of life, limb, or crippling injury, not only to themselves, but also to some unknown man, woman, child or complete family.

An astonishing fact is that the Christmas Season, when good will to all men should prevail, is the time of our greatest highway death toll. Over the 102 hour Christmas holiday period of 1958, Michigan suffered the loss of 21 lives on its highways. During the entire month of December, last year, 142 lives were lost in traffic.

The sorrow and loss attendant upon these so-called accidents was largely preventable. The major portion of them were caused by human failures and law violations.

As Christmas draws nearer, everyone tends to get into action. Highways become more congested by travelers and goods and supplies are rushed to consumers. Sidewalks and streets become crowded with laden pedestrians. Friendly celebrations, belated gifts, Christmas cards, people take chances, trusting in the other party's timidity or self-restraint to redeem the situation. Despite this, the traffic signs stand as helpful, patient guides and the laws made for our mutual protection must be obeyed. The spirit of the season calls for the best of good will to all men, particularly the mobile mob on the streets and highways.

The Children's Family Christmas Program will be held on Sunday, December 20, from 5-7 p.m. In song and story the Sunday School will tell of the Christ-child's birth. Refreshments will be served at an informal social hour following the program.

On Christmas Eve, December 24, two Candlelight Services will be held: one at 7:30 p.m. and a communion service at 11 p.m. The choir, under the direction of Mrs. Firth Gophell, will give a Choral Program of Christmas carols, and sing "Break Forth O Beauteous Heavenly Light," a Bach chorale, and "For Unto Us A Child Is Born" from Handel's Messiah.

Christmas morning, December 25, a worship service will be held at 10:30 A.M. On New Year's Eve, December 31, a Watchnight Service of prayer and also a communion service will be held at 8 p.m.

Shepherd King Busy With Welfare Work
