The Relief Committee of the Detroit Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women is promoting the foreign relief "Feed A Family" food packages with the slogan "Skip A Snack Once A Week."

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Average State Motorist Drove More in 1959

Michigan motorists drove an estimated 32 billion 424 million miles during 1959, a 5 1/2 percent increase over 1958, the Michigan State Highway Department reported recently.
Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie said the average motorist drove about 10,000 miles during 1959 compared to 9,700 miles last year.
Michigan motorists used nearly two and one-half billion gallons of gasoline and 400 million miles of tires during the year.
Traffic volume is measured by 55 permanent traffic recorders placed at key locations throughout the state.
Mackie said the traffic increase would have been greater if it had not been for the steel strike.
In the Metropolitan Detroit area, for instance, traffic was 13 percent higher during the first 10 months compared to the same period last year.
Based on registrations, drivers in five southeast Michigan counties—Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Monroe and St. Clair—accounted for approximately 17 billion miles or about 55 percent of the state's total.
Traffic in the Detroit area was up 12 percent compared to a year ago.
Mackie said traffic was up in all counties south of Highway 242 and in the western half of the Upper Peninsula.
