Washington

President Taft sent to congress a message of complaint on the report of the commission which has been conducting an examination in Alaska with a view to recommending routes for the construction of railroads...

Dominican revenues continue to elude and reductions of the national debt occur with gratifying rapidity, according to a report in Washington from Receiver General Fullam for the month of December last.

Brig. Gen. Albert I. Mills, chief of the militia division in Washington, has issued a special appeal to militia officers that immediate report be made where United States army sergeant instructors have been delinquent in their duties.

The United States senate passed the Norris bill, permitting the government to seize the imported goods of foreign companies violating the Sherman antitrust law.

Attorney General Wickham is assailed for his action in holding up the Texas indictments against John Archibald and other Standard Oil officials and Secretary Fisher is again charged with "subserviency to the oil trust."

The government suffered its first big defeat in the recent antitrust campaign when the U. S. Supreme court held that the officials of the United Shoe Machinery company had not violated the Sherman antitrust law by organizing that company.

Domestic

Police Commissioner Waldo, recognizing the gravity of the New York police situation brought about by the confession of grafting by Capt. Thomas W. Walsh, suspended from duty by Capt. Walsh, Inspector Dennis Sweeney, whom Capt. Walsh accused in his statement to District Attorney Williams, Capt. James F. Thompson and Capt. James Husey.

Helen Keller, famous blind and deaf girl, made her debut at Metropole, N. Y., as a public speaker when from the platform of the auditorium in the Hillside school she delivered a lecture to an audience that numbered nearly 1,000. Miss Keller spoke under the auspices of the Niagara branch of the Socialist party.

The plan for separating the Southern Pacific from the Union Pacific was formally approved at meetings in New York of the directorates of the two systems. All of the \$126,650,000 Union Pacific stock owned by the Southern Pacific will be offered to preferred and common shareholders of both properties at 98 1/2.

The wireless operator at the United States army post at Eagle, Miss., heard the government station at Key West, Fla., sending a message to Mars Island, Cal., on December 13, according to mail advices received. The air-line distance from Key West to Eagle is more than 4,000 miles.

James M. McNicholas, mining promoter, recently arrested in Boston and charged with separating Cleveland, Elyria, Conneaut and other Ohio towns from \$500,000 in fake mining schemes, pleaded not guilty when arraigned in federal court at Cleveland.

Five Vassar girls, tobogganing in the college grounds at Poughkeepsie, N. Y., lost control of the toboggan, which ran out on an artificial pond and broke through the ice. Elizabeth

By a vote of 22 to 4 the Wisconsin senate vindicated insurance Commissioner Herman L. Eken of charges of political activity in violation of the law under which he was appointed, refusing to confirm Governor McGoey's appointment of Lewis A. Anderson as commissioner, and sharply criticized the governor's action in dismissing Eken.

Fourteen of the crew of the tugboat Monarch were drowned when the vessel struck a submerged snag in Tehuila lake, in Mississippi, and sank.

Manipulation of securities on the New York Stock exchange was dealt a blow when the governing committee passed a resolution that any member guilty of executing orders for the purchase or sale of securities involving no change of ownership will be punished by suspension for a period not exceeding 12 months.

Three men were killed and six injured seriously when a ton-ton water gate dropped into a trench where the men were working in Detroit, Mich.

John Paul Farrell, a discharged apartment house janitor, confessed to the New York police that he had killed Mrs. Madeline Herron, by means of a bomb, and that the explosion had been caused the death of Grace Walker a year ago, and attempted the life of Judge Otto A. Rosenthal of the court of general sessions March 18, 1912.

Willie Hoppe retained his title as 18.2 ballkline billiard champion by defeating George Sutton of Chicago at the Hotel Astor, New York city, by a score of 500 to 70.

Gov. Woodrow Wilson announced the selection of Joseph Patrick Timilty to continue as secretary when he becomes the president of the United States, but asserted very emphatically that he absolutely had arrived at no decision as to cabinet selections.

A constitutional amendment for the recall of public officers was defeated by the Kansas house of representatives.

Capt. Ralph E. Byrnes, a retired lake steamer captain, was shot and killed by three thieves in his home on Ansel road at Cleveland, O., as Byrnes and his wife entered the house.

An indictment charging first degree murder was returned against Ralph Hoover, eighteen years old, charged with murdering his wife, sixteen years old, at Van Wert, O.

Foreign

By the sinking of the schooner Granada off Greyton, Nicaragua, twenty persons are known to have been drowned and the death list may reach twice that number. Among the known dead are twelve passengers.

James Bryce, British ambassador to Washington, has been appointed a member of the permanent court of arbitration at The Hague.

Edmond Pelletier, high official of the French department of justice, was murdered in his residence in Paris. A woman nurse who was attending him also was killed. The double murder is thought to have been committed by an unscrupulous accomplice of the gang of automobile bandits whose trial is now in progress.

Bradley Martin, leader of the ultra smart set in London, is dead, it is said of pneumonia at his residence in Chesterfield Gardens.

Balkan War

The renewal of hostilities between the Balkan allies and Turks makes no difference whatever to the attitude and unity of the powers, according to a authoritative statement made in London. It is added that while maintaining the strictest neutrality, the powers are carefully watching events and will miss no opportunity to shorten the duration of the fighting.

Bombardment of Adrianople by the Balkan allies began at the expiration of the armistice. Bulgaria has turned a deaf ear to the remonstrances of the powers against the resumption of war. Unless Turkey yields to the Balkan demands the allied armies will be tempted to drive the Turks out of Europe.

Personal

James Thomas died at his home at Monett, Mo., at the age of one hundred and six years. He outlived all but four of his eleven children. He had lived in Missouri 55 years.

The estate of James Bartlett Hammond, typewriter manufacturer, estimated at \$2,000,000, which is left by his will without restriction to the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, raises the total of large bequests to the museum within recent years to more than \$12,000,000.

E. W. Decker, president of a Minneapolis bank, proposes to secure the cooperation of the Minnesota and North Dakota bankers' association for the purpose of forming a new bank to be living. The solution, he says, is for the farmer to raise more stock.

When Mrs. W. Abbott of Minneapolis, Minn., started from an overheated stove pipe destroyed a large amount of clothing and equipment of the Michigan national guard, in Alpena. The army was but slightly damaged.

Income Bill for Michigan

A democratic member of the legislature, Rep. Schaefer, of St. Joseph, has cut in ahead of his party brethren down at Washington who talk of enacting a national income tax law now that the federal constitution has been amended to permit it.

Herb Schaefer, who is a farmer and fruit grower, introduced a bill Tuesday for a state income tax. This is it: On the first \$1,000 of a person's income the tax would be 1 per cent. On the second \$1,000, 1 1/2 per cent. On the third \$1,000, 1 3/4 per cent. On the fourth \$1,000, 1 1/2 per cent. On the fifth \$1,000, 2 per cent. On the sixth \$1,000, 2 1/2 per cent. On the seventh \$1,000, 3 per cent. On the eighth \$1,000, 3 1/2 per cent. On the ninth \$1,000, 4 per cent. On the tenth \$1,000, 4 1/2 per cent. On the eleventh \$1,000, 5 per cent. On the twelfth \$1,000, 5 1/2 per cent. And over \$12,000, 6 per cent.

Montenegrin Army Commands Scutari

The Montenegrin army besieging the Turkish fortress of Scutari carried the great Barjanjoli hill by assault after six hours of severe fighting. The infantrymen on several occasions came into such close quarters that hand-to-hand fighting was general along the line.

Barjanjoli hill dominates Scutari from the eastern side and the Montenegrins are mounting siege guns on the heights to bombard the principal points of the city.

The capture of Barjanjoli hill, at Scutari, by the Montenegrins, cost the victors 2,500 men in killed and wounded. The Turks lost 4,000 men, dead and wounded, on the field of battle.

Prince Katsura, Stoned by Mob

Prince Katsura, premier and minister of foreign affairs of Japan, was stoned by a mob in the streets of Calcutta immediately after he had offered to the emperor his resignation and that of the other members of the cabinet.

Several newspaper offices were also attacked by unruly crowds who attempted to set fire to the buildings. There were many riots in various parts of the city in the course of which a number of policemen and civilians were injured.

Mrs. Cleveland is Now Mrs. Preston

Mrs. Grover Cleveland and Thomas Jex Preston, Jr., were married by Princeton university; in Princeton, the executive residence of the university. No preliminary announcement had been made of the marriage and the utmost simplicity was observed in the ceremony.

The bride wore a simple white gown and carried a bouquet of white Killarney roses.

L. L. Wright, superintendent of public instruction, has made definite announcement of his candidacy for renomination at the republican convention to be held Feb. 11.

The Northeastern Michigan Development Bureau will take steps to carry out the proposal made at the annual meeting last month to ask the state to appropriate \$25,000 to be used in advertising Michigan.

Herman Ott, an Eckford farmer, narrowly escaped death when his wagon was struck by a Michigan Central train near Abbot. The horse was killed and the wagon smashed, but Ott was only slightly bruised.

Fears that the number of seats for the republican state convention to be held in Lansing on Feb. 11 might be nearly exhausted, have been allayed by the selection of the Coliseum on East Ottawa street instead of the Gladmer theater as originally planned.

The Marquette branch of the B. P. O. E. is preparing to build a three-story temple, the two upper floors and the basement will devote to the uses of the lodge and the ground floor to business purposes. Club rooms and bowling alleys will be provided, as well as a commodious auditorium. The cost will be about \$30,000.

Supra republican in county convention Tuesday, endorsed Circuit judge William O. Gage as the candidate for the nomination of supreme judge, and L. L. Wright for renomination as superintendent of public instruction.

Captain Scott and Party Found Frozen to Death

Capt. Robert F. Scott, the English polar explorer, and his party of 65 noted scientists and sailors were frozen to death in a blizzard which overwhelmed them after they reached the south pole on Jan. 18, 1912.

Expecting to meet the party and bring the members back to civilization, the Terra Nova, the vessel which had carried the expedition to the Antarctic, returned to the base of operations and found the entire party dead. The news was brought to Oamaru, New Zealand, by a signalled message from the vessel on her return.

The expedition consisted of 28 officers and scientists in addition to a crew of 23 picked men from the British royal navy.

The total number of deaths involved in the calamity is not exactly known, but it is believed that 60 scientists and sailors lost their lives. Capt. Scott's party reached the exact point where Ronald Amundsen planted the Norwegian flag at the south pole. They found there the flag constructed and left behind by Amundsen's party.

These facts were recorded in the documents found on the bodies of the dead explorers when they were recovered.

Dr. Mary Walker is Seriously Ill

Dr. Mary Walker, the noted suffrage leader is critically ill at a hospital in Chicago, from nervous shock, caused by a fall a week ago. Dr. Walker tripped on a rug as she entered a hall where she was to speak, she was bruised and physicians say her advanced age—the 81 years old—is responsible for the accident resulting so seriously.
