Following the opening prayer by Mrs. Ruth Erwin, the devotional thought centered around R.C. 5:6-10.

The importance of the Legislative department of the organization was stressed during the past year; it has assisted in defeating 23 bills; in Lansing that would have favored the liquor industry and increased the hazards on the highway and in homes.

Attention was called to the seven protective bills in the House of Representatives in Washington which would remove the alcoholic beverage service from airplanes, Service of the Williams Bill, H. R. 1075 through the local representative was called for.

An authorized teacher of Christian Science, he has devoted his full time for many years to the practical of Christian Science healing and to the service of the Christian Science organization.

The last two days of the trip was spent in Las Vegas, Nevada at the Dunes Hotel. They toured the Casinos and night clubs.

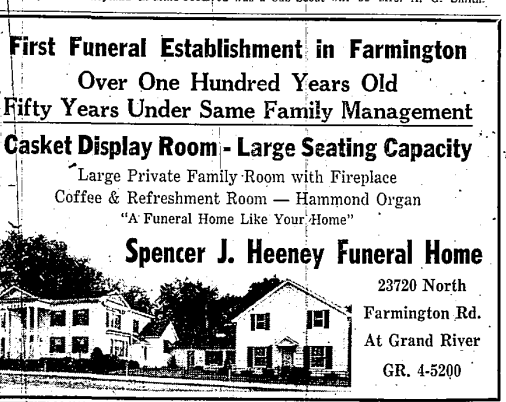
