

Trojans Shine, Falcons Humbled Over Weekend

Class 'A' Farmington Trojans' 6th Victim

The high-flying Class B Clarenceville Trojans put Farmington's Class A cagers to shame in a non-league rivalry contest Saturday night at Clarenceville by downing them 56-40 before a capacity crowd.

It was the Trojans' game from start to finish as they jumped off to an early lead and retained it throughout the game.

It was the sixth straight victory notched by Coach Lee Kemp's squad which has not been beaten since being edged in its season opener by South Lyon.

It was Doug Hanaford who led the Trojans in their offense, scoring honors behind Hanaford by collecting 24 of the well-balanced Trojan points. Hanaford joined with center Warren and Tony teammate Gene Scholes in taking 10 points each.

HARVEY CHAPMAN, standout performer on the Farmington squad, led his teammates in their losing cause with 16 points.

First quarter play was close with Clarenceville coming out two points ahead at quarter's end. In the second period, however, the Trojan offensive attack began to click and they outscored the Falcons 12-0 to leave the floor at halftime out from 16-0.

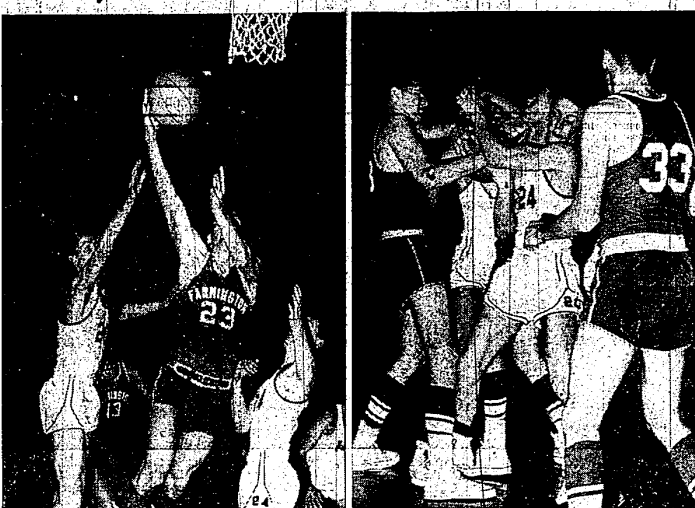

Falcons Downed by Pontiac, Dropped to 2nd in League

The Farmington Falcons dropped their first conference game of the season and first place in the Inter-Lakes League when they lost to Pontiac Northern 61-43 last Friday at Pontiac.

The Falcons managed to keep up to the fast pace-setting Huskies during the first quarter which ended in a 15-15 tie. Pontiac Northern's outstanding guard, Bruce Norton, made 11 of their 13 points while Harvey Chapman of the Falcons tallied 12.

The Huskies increased the pace in the second quarter, leaving the Falcons trailing 18-29 at halftime.

Nineteen points were chalked up for Pontiac Northern in the third quarter while Farmington tallied none. Norton just couldn't be stopped as he alone was credited with 12 of the 19 points.

In spite of a 21 point deficit going into the final quarter, the Falcons kept fighting and managed to hold the Huskies to 13 points while they chalked up 16. The final buzzer saw Pontiac Northern with a 61-43 victory over Farmington and first place in the league.

Falcon hoopers had 14 fouls while the Huskies made 14. The Falcon high scorer was Harvey Chapman with 11 points, four field goals and three free throws.

The total of 31 points for Pontiac Northern and set a new school record. The Falcons connected on 11 field goals and 21 free throws (52.4%) compared to the Huskies 21 field goals and 19 free throws (69%).

Waterford lost to Berkley Friday night so the Falcons are now the sole possessors of second place. Farmington will meet the Southfield Jays at Southfield tomorrow.

Sorrows Cagers Downed Twice
