ORDINANCE NO. 3458-A. AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE THROWING OR DEPOSITING OF LITTER IN PUBLIC PLACES IN THE CITY OF FARMINGTON.

Section 1. Short Title. This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Anti-Litter Ordinance".

Section 2. Definitions. For the purposes of this ordinance the following terms, phrases, words, and their derivations shall have the meaning given in this section. When used in this ordinance with the context, words used in the present tense include the future. Words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

(1) "Aircraft" is any contrivance, now known or hereafter invented, used or designed to fly in the air. It includes balloons, dirigibles and lighter-than-air dirigibles and balloons.
