## Library Fund Grant Received

The Michigan State Board for Libraries notified The Farmington City and Township District Library this week that it has met the financial qualification for a grant from the General Library Fund this year. The first payment of the 1959-60 grant was received at the time of the announcement, in the amount of \$270.58.

In accordance with the law the latest federal census figures are used to figure the grant on a per capita basis. Our first payment figures out at 2c per capita based on the 13,549 population figure of the 1950 census.

Money received from the General Library Fund is to be used to increase public library service and does not relieve the library of the financial obligation of providing adequate tax support. The State Aid Law prohibits use of this money for the purchase of sites or buildings, or for the payment of principal or interest charges on any indebtedness.

The Farmington Library allocation will be used for the purchase of much needed books, as it has been in past years.
