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Trace History Of Indian Name

ANN ARBOR—The story of a strange Indian hair style and how it led to the naming of a town, a lake, a village, a country, and mountain range in Michigan was told on the University of Michigan Broadcast Service (WUOM) program, "A Treasury of Michigan Names."

The name "Huron" was given to an Indian tribe by early French explorers who used it to describe the head of a war canoe.

Legend along the St. Lawrence River often shaved part of their head, leaving a ridge of hair in the middle, making for the comparison. The French also meant "wild and savage" in the French vocabulary.

The second definition, "wild and savage" could refer to the Lake Huron during fall storms, and spring ice break-ups, or the Huron Mountains in Marquette-Baraga County.
