Caution Needed In Buying Seed

With spring planting not many weeks away, John E. Garver, chief analyst of the Michigan Department of Agriculture's seed section, has a word of caution to farmers and Gardeners regarding pre-inoculated seed.

Those who buy pre-inoculated seed," advised Mr. Garver, "should note the expiration date on the special tag or label attached to the seed container. Seed not planted by this date should be re-inoculated in the regular manner with a good commercial culture before planting."

Garver explained that pre-inoculation dies with the advent of warm weather. Because of this farmers should not buy more of this type of seed than might be wanted for spring planting, and dealers should not add the cost of pre-inoculation to seed after the expiration date shown on the tag or label.

READ THE TAG or label when buying lawn seed or field seed if one wants to have the finished crop later this year become the realization of spring-time hopes.

Under Michigan law each container of such seed must bear a statement declaring the purity, germination and recent date

of test of the seed it contains. Purity means the seed's freedom from inert matter or the seeds of weeds and other crops. Germination means the ability

of the seed to produce a good plant in the field. The higher the percentage of germination the greater the chance of getting a good stand of plants.

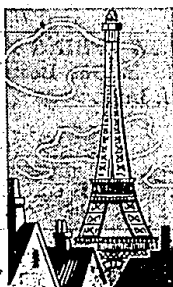
