Notice of Special Election Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a Special Election of the qualified electors of the aforesaid School District will be held in the Clarenceville Junior High School, formerly known as Clarenceville High School, located at 20210 Michigan Road in said School District, on Monday, March 21, 1960, and at such Special Election the following propositions will be submitted to the qualified electors of the School District:

PROPOSITION I: Bonding Proposition

Shall Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Eight Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$850,000.00) and issue its bonds therefor, for the purpose of paying the cost of additions to existing buildings, of erecting new school buildings, of furnishing and equipping the same, and of making improvements to existing school sites?

PROPOSITION II: Reclassification Proposition

Shall Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan, be reclassified and become a school district of the third class?

PROPOSITION III: Operating Millage Increase Proposition

Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in the Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan for all purposes except payment of obligation, incurred before December 8, 1932, be increased, as provided by Section 21, Article X of the Constitution of Michigan, by two-tenths of one per cent (2 mills) of the assessed value, as equalized, of all property in the school district for a period of (1) year, 1960, and seven-tenths of one per cent (7 mills) of the assessed valuation, as equalized, of all property in the school district for a period of five (5) years, 1961 to 1965, both inclusive, to be used exclusively for the purpose of paying operational expenses of said school district?

The polls of election will be open from 7:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M., Eastern Standard Time.

Each person voting on the proposition to increase the total tax rate limitation (millage increase) and to reclassify the School District to a Third Class District must be a citizen of the United States, above the age of twenty-one (21) years, and have resided in the State of Michigan (60 months), and in the School District thirty (30) days next preceding the day of election. Each person voting on the proposition of borrowing money and issuing bonds, in addition to the preceding qualifications, must be the owner of property assessed for taxes within the School District or the lawful husband or wife of such owner.

Only registered voters are eligible to vote.

TAKE NOTICE that with reference to Proposition I, the Board of Education has estimated that Eight Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$850,000.00) is the amount of money necessary to be borrowed for the purposes above mentioned, all of which it is necessary to borrow by means of a bond issue.

2 CHS Cagers On All-League

Two Clarenceville basketball players, Gene Scholtes and Tony Giacobazzi, have been named to "All League Teams" selected by Detroit newspapers.
