Clarenceville took the first win in the field events by putting the shot 49'10". Truste Hofmeier placed third in this event, giving Farmington its first two points. The Falcons failed to place in the broad jump, where Bentley dominated with a 19'8 1/2" jump. Two F.H.S. trackmen, Mike Tilder and Jerry Seppanen shared fourth place in the high jump.
