Plan Swimming Club In North Farmington

Believe it or not, after the cold weather we have had, not summer days are not too far away. Go back in your memory to the hot days of last summer and recall how you must have longed to go for a swim!

Last year a swimming club was formed in Kendallwood which is a real tribute to those who founded and developed it. All who belong must be very proud of this beautiful pool.

As the result of the tremendous interest shown in that club, a group of local families has organized a new club, Woodbrooke Hills Swimming Club. This is a private, non-profit corporation, organized to construct, own and operate a swimming pool solely for the benefit of its members.

Several days ago the club contracted for five acres of ground on Farmington Road, 1/4 mile north of 13 Mile Road on the west side. Right now there is an old barn standing on the southeast corner of the property but eventually there will be a beautifully landscaped and terraced swimming pool and picnic area to replace it.

The upper level of the terraced land will have the "L" shaped pool, a wading pool for the younger children and a modern cabana containing showers and dressing rooms. The next level will be a picnic area and at the bottom level will be an additional picnic area, play area and parking grounds. In addition to all this, a very picturesque stream runs through the southwest portion of land.

THE FIVE ACRES of the club will be surrounded by a projected modern community development of outstanding homes. The site is opposite the New Orchard Methodist Church. With these surroundings coupled with the proposed plan of the club, the finished product should be nothing short of breathtaking.

Club membership has been limited to 300 families and the annual dues are \$30 with an initiation fee of \$50 due from any member accepted after June 15. Applications may be submitted to the membership chairman or to any of the directors. Any Farmington resident may apply.
