

City Council Proceedings

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

A regular meeting of the City Council was held on April 19, 1960, at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Lindbert.

Roll Call: Brotherton, Lindbert, Peterson, Thayer, and Quinn. Absent: None.

City Officials Present: City Manager, Brotherton, Lindbert, Peterson, Thayer, and Quinn. Attorney Kelly and City Clerk DeVriendt.

Minutes of Previous Meeting: Minutes of the April 12, 1960, meeting were read and approved as published. Motion carried, all ayes.

Public Hearings: A. Special Assessment: Paving of Cass Avenue. Mayor Lindbert opened the public hearing of the Special Assessment of Cass Avenue, from State to North Blvd. at 7:30 p.m. at all interested property owners.

Comments: Mr. Robert Lindbert, 3245 Cass Avenue, West 3245 Cass Avenue, recommended that the sidewalk be installed at the same time as paving and included in the special assessment roll of 1960.

Mr. Harry Lapham, 22855 May reminded the Council that children attending the City School must walk in the street and there is a traffic hazard.

The Council instructed the City Engineer to prepare a rough estimate of the cost of the sidewalk on Cass Avenue and to return to Council at next regular meeting.

All interested parties having been heard, the Mayor declared the public hearing closed at 7:40 p.m.

B. Special Assessment: Paving of Cass Avenue. Mayor Lindbert opened the public hearing of the Special Assessment of Cass Avenue, from State to North Blvd. at 7:40 p.m. at all interested property owners.

Comments: The City Manager reported that the City Engineer had estimated the cost of the sidewalk on Cass Avenue at \$12,000. Mr. William H. Hearn, 3340 Liberty, was concerned about the grade of the proposed street and grade of sidewalk that had been installed on the south west side of State and Cass Street.

The Council assured Mr. Hearn that the sidewalks will follow the street grade.

All interested parties having been heard, the Mayor declared the public hearing closed at 8:10 p.m.

C. Special Assessment: Paving of Cass Avenue. Mayor Lindbert opened the public hearing of the Special Assessment of Cass Avenue, from State to North Blvd. at 8:10 p.m. at all interested property owners.

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All interested parties having been heard, the Mayor declared the public hearing closed at 8:32 p.m.

A. 1960 Paving Program. Motion made by Brotherton and supported by Peterson to award the low bid for the 1960 Paving program to Thomas Construction Co. in the amount of \$71,279.75, and the portions of the cost to be paid by Oakland County, Michigan, and the City of Farmington. Assessed, Sewer funds and the City of Farmington.

Roll Call: Ayes: Brotherton, Lindbert, Peterson, Thayer, and Quinn. Nays: None. Motion carried.

B. Communication: Paving of Cass Avenue. Mayor Lindbert opened the public hearing of the Special Assessment of Cass Avenue, from State to North Blvd. at 8:32 p.m. at all interested property owners.

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Resolution: That the City of Farmington do hereby adopt the following resolution:

1. That the agreement between the City of Farmington and Oakland County, Michigan, for widening of Farmington Road between Scum and Nine Mile Road be and is hereby approved.

2. That Earl F. Scherffus, City Manager, and is hereby authorized to act as agent for said City in delinquent tax cases.

3. That Earl F. Scherffus, City Manager, and is hereby authorized to sign and execute said agreement for and on behalf of the City of Farmington.

This resolution was adopted at a regular meeting of the City Council held on April 18, 1960.

Roll Call: Ayes: Councilmen Lindbert, Peterson, Thayer, and Quinn. Nays: Councilman DeVriendt. Resolution Declared Adopted.

B. Resolution Re: Traffic Control Order No. 2. Motion made by Peterson and supported by Thayer to adopt Traffic Control Order No. 2.

Effective April 18, 1960 the following regulation of traffic and parking shall be in effect:

No parking at any time shall be in effect in any of the following areas in the City of Farmington:

1. On any curb parking in any cul-de-sac area.

2. No curb parking between dual driveways of any business establishment.

Motion carried, all ayes.

C. Resolution No. 3. Re: 1960 Special Assessment. Mayor Lindbert opened the public hearing of the Special Assessment of Cass Avenue, from State to North Blvd. at 7:30 p.m. at all interested property owners.
