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RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO ADOPT THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON

At a meeting of the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, in the Town Hall in the City of Farmington, on the 12th day of April, 1960, the following members being present: Hall, Bassette, Brown, Hug and Wilcox, and the following members being absent: none, the following resolution was offered by Wilcox, supported by Hug and carried:

RESOLVED

That it is the intent of the Township Board of the Township of Farmington to amend the Zoning Ordinance of the Township of Farmington, in accordance with the provisions of Act 184 of the Public Acts of 1945, in the following particulars:

1. By deleting Sections I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, VIII, X, XI, XII, XIII, XIV, XV, XVI and XVII of the Preamble and Schedules forming a part of said Ordinance and substituting therefor new Sections designated Articles I through XIII, new Title and Preamble and new Schedules of Regulations, copies of which are available and may be examined in the office of the Township Clerk at any time during regular office hours.

2. By the rezoning of all property in the Township of Farmington presently classified as Residence 1, 2, 3 or 4, to the following: Residence RA-1, RA-2, RA-3 and RA-4 as provided in and subject to the provisions of this Resolution, provided that exact zoning boundaries are to be shown on quarter section maps to be maintained by the Township Clerk and which shall be open to examination at any time during regular office hours.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED:

1. That within ten (10) days from the date hereof this Resolution shall be published in the Farmington Enterprise, Farmington, Michigan.

2. That the Township Clerk shall submit to the Township Board for public hearing and recommendation as required by law.

Mr. Berling met his wife Mary 32 years ago at a swimming party at Belle Isle, Calumet. The meeting will never be forgotten as Mr. Berling was the hero of the day when he saved his wife to be from drowning in the Detroit river.

The Berlings have three children, Dennis, Martha and Barbara. Dennis is in the 11th grade at Farmington High School. Barbara attends Duncel Jr. High and Martha is in her freshman year at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah. Her father is currently in a business trip to the west and plans to visit Farmington on his way back to Farmington.

Big interests of the Berling family are swimming, traveling and sports in general, as well as Farmington community affairs. They have lived at 2830 Powers Road for the past nine years.

Ray and Melvin McHugh were married in 1928 and have three sons. Ray, the youngest, is a business manager for Berling-McHugh and Don is with Burroughs Corp. The youngest boy, Fred,

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Navy Seeking Top Notch Men

Both the Navy Reserve and the Regular Navy are seeking caliber young men in the Farmington area.

The Oakland County Naval Reserve Center in Pontiac outlines several advantages for the young men who enter the program. They strongly recommend that high school boys look into what they have to offer and give it careful consideration and discuss it with their parents.

Some of the advantages of the naval program include: getting in at an early age and setting in military obligation out of the way rather than waiting for the draft and interrupting a career at a later date; in the event of the military would have that much time for pay purposes plus perhaps two advancements in rating behind him; and the big advantage of serving with high caliber people.

YOUNG MEN are cautioned not to delay their military plans too long as they will be obligated to register with the draft board at the age of 18 and face an army call after that.

Navy Reserve officials suggest that boys make up their minds by the time they are 17 and just what branch of service they are interested in. The naval reserve program offers an opportunity for summer duty without interfering in their education plans. They may even be selected to be trained as Navy aviators in one of several universities.

Seeks Change in Student Groups

Highly gifted students forge ahead dramatically when they aren't held back waiting for slower classmates to catch up, declares Frank O. Copley (Ph. D.), University of Michigan professor of Latin.

ABILITY grouping can take a number of forms, Dr. Copley points out. Programs may be "track" or "trial" system tests the student and assigns him to a given ability group with which he takes all his classes. Another type of grouping tests the student for ability in certain subjects, and assigns him to a group to study a particular subject or subjects.

"It is clearly not true — as many have believed — that bright students 'spark' their slower classmates," he says.

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
