DeWitt Speaks At Franklin
A long-time personal friend of the minister, the Rev. Jesse R. DeWitt will be the guest preacher of the Franklin Community Church, Sunday, May 3, 1959. Since his graduation from Garrett Biblical Institute in Evanston, Illinois, Mr. DeWitt has served Church Methodist Churches in Michigan. His most recent parish was the Oak Park Methodist Church. At both Oak Park and at the Aldersgate Methodist Church, he was in charge of the erection of the new buildings.
Since 1958 he has been the executive Secretary of the Board of Missions and Church Extension for Michigan Methodism, having his office in downtown Detroit. Under his direction the Churches of this territory have developed a new strategy for Church location and for meeting the needs of mushrooming new areas.
Mr. DeWitt has been very well known for his work with youth, in the summer camping programs and in local Church activities. He has also been known for his work in brotherhood movements of various sorts and was given a brotherhood award while serving the Church in Oak Park. With Mrs. DeWitt and his daughters, Mr. DeWitt lives in Royal Oak. His sermon topic on May 3 is "The Measure of a Home". Mr. DeWitt and the Rev. Robert A. Seals, host pastor, attended seminary together and have maintained a long and personal friendship and their careers have paralleled in many instances. The service is at 10:00 a.m.
