School Lunch A Big Program

In the month of March 60, 288 school lunches were served in the 16 Farmington schools offering the school lunch program. In addition there were 2,195 adult lunches served for an average of 2,940 a day.

Each lunch served includes a pint of whole milk which is sold to students for three cents. In the elementary schools the total lunch charge is 25 cents. It is 30 cents in the Junior High schools and 35 cents in the high school. Adult lunches are 40 cents.

There are 51 people working in the school cafeterias including the school lunch supervisor Mrs. Mildred Musselman, and a manager for each cafeteria.
