**Falcon Track Team Bows to Pon. Northern**  
Farmington's track team lost a league meet with Pontiac Northern last Thursday afternoon.  
F.H.S. thinclads and the Northern Huskies took almost an even number of first places. Sophomore hurdler Mike Tiller placed first in the high jump with a 5'6" jump, the 180 yard hurdles with a time of 22.2 and the 120 yd. high hurdles. His three victories made him the most consistent winner of the meet.  
Harv Chapman ran the 100 yd. dash in 10.8 for another first place. Dave Helmer completed the mile run in 5:06 to place first. The medley relay team, composed of Doug Henry, Jack Atchison, John Hestede, and Bob Backoff, brought additional first place honors to Farmington by running in 15.  
The Falcons took an equal number of second places. Mike Tomlin placed second in the shot put event. Bob Rufford came in second in both the 100 yd. dash, in 11.0, and the 220 yd. dash. John Fulton won a second place in the 800 yd. run with a 2:08.6 time, and Gary Atchison won the same in the 440 yd. dash with a time of 1:02.2.  
Farmington's third place winners were Dave Busch, in the shot put; Rodney Kinnisto, in the pole vault; Don Heinonen, in the 800 yd. run; and Harv Chapman, in the 220 yd. dash.  
According to track coach Gene Freed, the results were not really discouraging, for this year's track team is very young and made up of a lot of sophomores and boys who have not participated in track before. "We are, though," commented Freed, "going to be the most improved track team in the league."

**Milford Wins In Track Meet**  
Led by Mert Roberts and Tony Giacobazzi who remained unbeaten in their specialties, the Trojan track squad finished in a second place tie in a tri-meet run under the lights at Milford. The host Milford Redskins rolled to 76 points, more than doubling the 304 points gathered by W. Bloomfield and Clarencville.  
Roberts was the busiest and most successful Trojan as he won the low hurdles in 22.1 seconds to remain unbeaten in the event; won the high jump at 5'4 1/4"; placed 3rd in the high hurdles, and ran a leg on the winning 880 relay team.  
Completing his pace of nearly 4 foot-a-week improvement, Giacobazzi pushed the shot 43' 10 1/4".  
A rarity occurred in the final race of the evening as Clarencville and Milford finished in a dead heat for first.
