Ford Grants Total Million

The trustees of Ford Motor Company Fund have authorized \$1,000,000 in grants to leading private universities and colleges during the next four years. Henry Ford II, president of the Fund, announced.

For 1960, grants of \$25,000 each will go to 10 universities. Subsequent grants will be made on an annual basis, Mr. Ford said.
