## Great Lakes Men Meet on Fishing Laws

Officials from the Michigan, Illinois and Wisconsin conservation departments, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the Great Lakes Fishery Commission met at Lansing recently to discuss adopting new regulations to form commercial fishing regulations, where possible, in the Great Lakes.

The fish rehabilitation program for lake trout in the upper Great Lakes serving as the focal point and viewing the demands in many quarters for further restrictions on commercial fishermen, officials hesitated to support liberalizing certain regulations as suggested. They felt the protection of trout on the mesh size of club nets should not be removed, as recommended by some fishermen. Michigan officials indicated they would consider changing the size limit on perch in a triangular area of Green Bay to match Wisconsin's eight-inch limit. Some of Michigan's commercial fishermen contend they are at a disadvantage under the current eight and one-half inch limit.

Pending results of an experiment by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, action was delayed in permitting use of the otter trawl, a new type of fishing gear, in Michigan's Great Lakes waters.

**COMMENTING ON:** objections to commercial fishing for lake trout in Lake Superior, an official of the Great Lakes Fishery Commission said fishermen are taking immature trout which otherwise would be lost to the sea lamprey. This predator has virtually wiped out the lake's trout spawning stock. Commercial catches are the primary yardsticks for measuring the lake's trout population and effects of the lamprey control program, it was added.

Other officials pointed out that many hatchery-stocked fish are showing up in commercial catches and with encouraging signs of the sea lamprey's control in sight, greater protection of the lake's remnant trout population was in order.

## 6th Champions Track Meet Set For June 3

The 6th Annual High School Champion of Champions Track and Field Meet will be held Friday night, June 3rd, at Angel Field, Kalamazoo College. At the present time it appears unlikely that any local boys will be invited.

This meet features outstanding track stars from throughout Michigan competing on an individual basis. Constanters are not divided into class A, B, C and D as in other Michigan high school sports events.

Invitations are extended by the sponsors, The Kalamazoo Jaycees, after a group of Kalamazoo area coaches have made selections from performances in the regional and state meets. Medals and trophies are presented to the first three finishers and the winning relay teams.

In 1959, 85 prep track stars from 10 schools competed for year to the outstanding performer. Warren Cawley of Farmington repeated his 1958 win with meet record times of 2:44.4 and 19.3 in the high and low hurdles.

Other previous winners included: Don Massengale, Ionia, 1957; Bob Jones, Battle Creek, 1956; John Palmer, St. Louis, 1955.

Sanctioned by the MHSAA, the meet has developed a fine reputation among Michigan high school coaches.
