was not being lowered this year as promised a year earlier when the city tax rate was increased from 10 to 12 mills per \$1,000. Councilmen were firm in their stand that they had made no such promise but had agreed only to do everything possible to lower it. A point brought out during discussion was the fact that the normal operating levy had actually been lowered since one mill was added to retire water bond obligations with no increase being called for in the total 12 mill rate.

One of the big objections voiced by Boise on behalf of the Warner Farms Assn. was in regard to the proposed use of \$10,500 for blacktopping of a large parking lot "A" in the downtown business district. Since private businesses are to benefit, the Warner Farms group feels that they should stand the cost for this, Boise commented.

IT WAS explained during discussion that this parking area had been planned by the city for some time as part of a community-at-large redevelopment program. It was the feeling of the city manager and Council that the city should share in the cost for this additional free parking area in view of the fact that most of the money proposed to be spent had been derived from parking meter collections made.

Boise also expressed the feeling that members of the public safety department should get a raise in pay. This should be provided for in the budget even if funds for an additional public safety department clerk were not available. Boise stated that he had to be used to accomplish it, Boise contended.

HE WAS HIGH in his praise of the work being done by present members of the public safety department and expressed concern over the fact that their pay was somewhat lower than that being offered by safety departments in other communities in this area.

At the close of the hearing, the mayor commended the city manager on the excellent job he had done in preparing the budget. Forrest also commended Manager Scheraga for his preparation of an easily understandable budget and expressed appreciation for the time the manager spent with members of his group in discussing the proposed budget.
